QUOTE

AS A MEMBER OF THE AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE YOU ARE ALREADY PART OF A SPECIAL TEAM, PERFORMING WORK OF NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE. ON THIS OCCASION YOU HAVE BEEN FORMED INTO ANOTHER UNIQUE AND IMPORTANT TEAM - ONE TASKED WITH SAVING LIVES AND IMPROVING THE LIVING CONDITIONS OF A DISPOSSESSED GROUP OF PEOPLE.

WE ARE ALL AWARE, AT LEAST SUPERFICIALLY, OF THE EXTENT OF THE HUMAN SUFFERING THAT YOU WILL HAVE TO CONFRONT. IT WILL NOT BE A PLEASANT OR AN EASY TASK, BUT AS SERVICE PEOPLE YOU ARE USED TO VENTURING INTO AREAS OTHERS AVOID. IN ADDITION YOU WILL HAVE THE SATISFACTION OF KNOWING THAT YOUR WORK WILL MAKE A REAL CONTRIBUTION TO PREVENTING DEATH AND DISEASE, ESPECIALLY AMONGST THE YOUNG, THE OLD AND THE INFIRM. YOU WILL ALSO DEMONSTRATE THAT AUSTRALIA WILL DO WHAT IT CAN TO HELP IN SUCH EMERGENCIES.

THE RISKS WHICH YOU WILL FACE HAVE BEEN ASSESSED AS MODERATE. A MODERATE RISK IN THE DEFENCE CONTEXT IS DIFFERENT TO THAT RISK ELSEWHERE, BUT THAT'S SOMETHING YOU ALREADY FACE ON A REGULAR BASIS. NEVER-THE-LESS, THE CONFLICT IS OVER AND THUS THE PRIMARY SOURCE OF DANGER HAS BEEN REMOVED. THE HAZARDS ARE PRINCIPALLY DISEASE RELATED AND DUE TO THE UNCERTAINTY OF THE SITUATION, BUT I HAVE CONFIDENCE IN YOUR TRAINING AND IN THE MEASURES WHICH HAVE BEEN TAKEN TO PROTECT YOU.

ON BEHALF OF THE PRIME MINISTER AND DEARLY MINE I WISH YOU A SAFE AND SUCCESSFUL MISSION.

1. SITUATION

- a. Australian Contingent (ASC) consists of 75 pax.
- b. Initial deployment 30 days in AO; reviewed in Jun 91 with a possible extension up to a maximum of 90 days.
- c. DIO threat assessment is moderate. For purposes of VEA, OP HABITAT has been declared hazardous.
- d. Recon gp departed 4 May and will receive main body in the AO. Main Body on 48 hrs NTM from 060001Z May 91. No move before 10 May 91.
- e. No rotation is envisaged.
- f. LHQ resp for mounting and conducting OP. The ASC will be attached to COMBRITISH FORCES (CBFH) and operate with 3 CDO Bde (RM), probably under OP CON.
- g. ASC to remain under national command through LHQ.

2. MISSION To provide a contingent to undertake humanitarian Relief OP in northern Iraq.

3. EXECUTION. Four Phases.

- a. Phase 1. Pre deployment phase. Prep of ASC and deployment of Recon Gp.
- b. Phase 2. Deployment by civil air (747 and Antonov).
- c. Phase 3. Conduct of OPS. Tasks include:
 - (1) provide Level 1 (primary) med and dent care to refugees,
 - (2) provide health advice to refugees and camp administration,
 - (3) investigate health problems with refugee population,
 - (4) supervise sanitary and elementary engineering works for disease control,
 - (5) operate a field shower unit,
 - (6) operate water purification equipment, and
 - (7) other relief missions within the capability of the ASC.
- d. Phase 4. Redeployment.

4. ADMIN AND LOG (PERS ISSUES).

- a. The British Government has agreed to provide admin and log spt for the ASC under an MOU which is being negotiated. ASC to deploy with 30 days operational supplies. The ASC is to be self sufficient until it marries up with its fostering unit which will provide rations, POL, consumables, canteen stores.
- b. Finance. Initial deployment funded by Defence (Army). Supplementation thereafter.
- c. Conditions of Service. Standard Deployment. Government approved allowances are:
 - (1) Daily allowance of \$28.38 (including incidental and hazard element).
 - (2) Normal overseas outfit allowance of \$190.00.
 - (3) Normal field/separation allowance.
 - (4) Zone rebate (non-tax exempt) is being sought.
- d. Compensation/Preparation Benefits. OPERATION HABITAT has been declared hazardous for the purposes of the Veteran's Entitlement Act. The provisions under this section of the Act include:
 - (1) normal invalidity benefits,
 - (2) 24 hr 'any occurrence' cover for death or invalidity,
 - (3) the member does not have to prove an injury or disease was caused through Service in the area. (The Department of Veteran's Affairs has to prove it could not have been related.); and
 - (4) NO access to Service Pension. (Normal DFRDB death and invalidity benefits remain in force.)
- e. Structure/Manning. Note attached. Formal establishment cover for the Contingent, called Australian Contingent HABITAT (ASC HABITAT), will be raised by COB 8 May and effective from 3 May. SCMA/MS and LHQ will commence formal posting action soonest. LHQ eligibility criteria was FE, DPI, MED and Dent Class 2 and completed overseas med board.
- f. Postal. There is no intention to seek Ministerial intervention for concessional rates/allowances. Proposal seeks limit to Australian domestic rates for contingent members with International freight charges met by Defence (Army). Routing of mail via Sydney International Mail Exchange via MOOUK. Postal address is to be advised.
- g. Replacement/Reinforcement. Key pers and policy for replacement to be advised by LHQ.

- h. CASEVAC. LHQ awaiting ~~advice~~ tactical field CASEVAC spt from Recon Gp. Level 3 facy (field hospital) provided by UK. Strategic CASEVAC via UK Casevac system through London to Australia. Concern about field CASEVAC spt exists as equipment/stores for airlift deployment may bulk out with ASC Ambulances being off loaded. Status TBA.
 - i. Honours and Awards. ASC members may be eligible for the Australian Service Medal. ACPers is the Delegate and DGSP2 has carriage for forwarding proposal.
 - j. Family and Welfare Support. FLO appointed by LHQ. ACS support provided through donor units and coordinated by LHQ eg Newsletter and 008 number.
 - k. Canteens/Amenities. Provided by foster UK unit. Provisioning of funds for periodicals, newspapers etc being sought by DPS-A.
 - l. Pay/Finances. WO Finance included in Recon party for contingent. Coord by LHQ and awaiting Recon Gp advice.
 - m. Legal/Discipline. Legal Offr included in contingent. Legal Status of ASC members to be advised. No legal arrangements will be settled for contingent presence in Iraq. Convening authority, Power of CO, and Summary auth appointed by LHQ.
 - n. Civilian Attachments. A Reporter and Cameraman is attached to the ASC and employment is governed by JSP 41. DGPI/LHQ has carriage. It is not known if these civilians are to form part of the 75 manpower ceiling for the ASC.

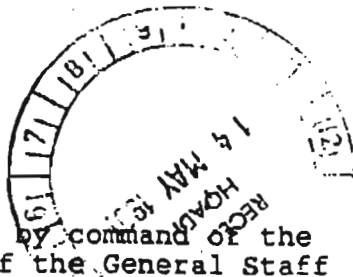

INTRODUCTION

General

1. On 1 May 91 the Australian Government agreed to offer an ADF contingent to assist in the relief efforts for the Kurdish people of Iraq. The offer was accepted, and a Government decision was taken on 6 May 91 to provide a contingent of approximately 70 ADF personnel in support of the international humanitarian relief operation in northern Iraq (NIZ).
2. IAW Reference A, the operation is to be known as OP HABITAT. The Army contribution is to be titled 'Australian Contingent Operation HABITAT (ASC HABITAT)'.
3. Concurrent with preparation for deployment, HQ ADF is preparing and will effect a Memorandum of Understanding with the Government of the United Kingdom, covering ADF participation and relationships with British Forces in NIZ.

Scope of Instruction

4. This instruction is in four parts:
 - a. Part 1 - General Outline,
 - b. Part 2 - Operational Matters,
 - c. Part 3 - Personnel Matters, and
 - e. Part 4 - Financial Matters.

PART ONE - GENERAL OUTLINE

Composition

5. The composition of ASC HABITAT is at Annex A.
6. ASC HABITAT is created on Establishment Table 7753-02-01 vide Reference F.

Authority

7. Reference A provides the authority for the mounting of OP HABITAT and for the preparation and deployment of ASC HABITAT.
8. This instruction provides authority for the expenditure of funds associated with OP HABITAT, and for the maintenance of ASC HABITAT throughout the Operation.
9. A Status of Forces Agreement for AS personnel employed on OP HABITAT will be issued separately by HQ ADF.

Chain of Command

10. OP HABITAT is to be commanded by CDF through LCAUST, with the chain of command shown in Reference B. The commander of ASC HABITAT is to be titled 'COMASC HABITAT'.

Manning of ASC HABITAT

11. LCAUST is to select the personnel who comprise ASC HABITAT. Where applicable, HOC, MS and SCMA are to be consulted by LHQ staff. Emplane and deplane advice is to be provided to MS and SCMA as appropriate.

Logistic Support and Equipment

12. Army Office (LOG Div)(DLOP) in conjunction with LHQ and HQ Log Comd is to coordinate the issue to ASC HABITAT of any items of equipment required from outside, Land Comd. Coordination of logistic support to ASC HABITAT is outlined in Reference C.

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13. ASC HABITAT is allocated UDC 45176 vide Reference F.

Movement

14. Movement within Australia of ASC HABITAT, together with the deployment of Reconnaissance Group/s, is the responsibility of LHQ. Costs associated with movement are to be isolated for subsequent submission to Army Office (DRM-A).

15. The deployment of ASC HABITAT to the NIZ area and redeployment to AS is the responsibility of HQ ADF, as shown in Reference G. Log Comd is to provide assistance to Land Comd as requested.

Finance

16. Financial aspects, including methods of payment and accounting, are at Part 4 and Annex C of this instruction. All costs are to be identified against SLID/SLAC E044.

PART TWO - OPERATIONAL MATTERS

General

17. LCAUST is responsible for all operational aspects of OP HABITAT.

18. ASC HABITAT has been raised as an Army unit within Land Comd vide Reference F.

Training

19. LCAUST is responsible for pre-deployment training of ASC HABITAT.

Security

20. LHQ is responsible for producing security guidelines for information, personnel and materiel for OP HABITAT.

Commander's Diary

21. COMASC HABITAT is to maintain a commander's diary with effect from his appointment until the disbandment of ASC HABITAT. The diary is to be maintained IAW MLW One 6.1 (Staff Duties in the Field) and the instructions contained in the Commander's Diary cover sheet (AF C219 adapted). To ensure effective historical records are produced, it is essential that the diary provides a comprehensive record of ASC HABITAT dispositions and significant events, with the retention of relevant maps showing locations and dates, together with personal observations from the commander and key personnel.

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Reporting

22. LHQ is to forward to CGS copies of all SITREPS required vide Reference A and any other relevant reports relating to ASC HABITAT.

Rear Link Communications

23. The requirements for communications between AS and ASC HABITAT are contained in Reference A.

PART THREE - PERSONNEL MATTERS

General

24. HQ ADF has advised certain conditions of service entitlements for ASC HABITAT vide Reference D. These are incorporated in the following summary of personnel support factors.

Pay

25. Up to three pays may be drawn in advance prior to deployment.

26. Prior to deployment, members should complete a Form TF-19 Order to Pay Agent, and adjust allotments to enable payment to spouse or other nominated person.

Allowances

?x 27. A daily allowance of \$A 28.38 has been approved. This allowance subsumes Travelling Allowance and Post Allowance and includes an element for Hazardous Service. The allowance is payable from the time of arrival in Turkey.

28. Overseas Outfit Allowance (INDMAN Instr 3602). The basic element of Overseas Outfit Allowance, \$A190.00, is payable to eligible members. A list of those eligible has been approved by DSC-A and forwarded separately to LHQ.

29. Field Allowance. Field Allowance, \$A13.11 per day, is payable in accordance with INDMAN Instr 0209.

30. Separation Allowance. Separation Allowance, currently \$A4.00 per day, is payable in accordance with INDMAN Instr 0202.

Rations and Quarters Charges

31. R and Q charges will not be levied.

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Retention of Living Out Allowance (LOA)

32. Applications for retention of LOA should be forwarded to DSC-A.

Removal Entitlements

33. There is no entitlement for removal or storage of effects.

Taxation

34. A Section 79B Zone Rebate is being sought for taxation concession purposes. This equates to the Zone A Rebate that applies within Australia.

Leave Provisions

35. Normal leave provisions apply for entitlement to Basic Recreation Leave (BRL) and extra Recreation Leave (ERL). In addition members will be entitled to Remote Locality Leave of 10 days per year at a pro rata rate.

Compensation/Repatriation Benefits

36. OP HABITAT has been declared "Hazardous Service" under the Veterans Entitlements Act (VEA) 1986. In addition to the normal invalidity benefits under part IV of the VEA, the following conditions apply:

- a. 24 hour 'any occurrence' cover for death or invalidity benefits,
- b. favourable standard of proof for cases,
- c. no access to Service Pension, and
- d. no DSH Loan or additional loan is available to post-1985 enlistees.

Service Medal

37. Eligibility for the Australian Service Medal is yet to be approved.

AUSDIL, NOTICAS and Welfare

38. LHQ is responsible for the welfare support of ASC HABITAT members and dependents. DPS-A will provide assistance in the formulation of a family support/welfare plan where requested.

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39. Normal AUSDIL provisions and NOTICAS procedures are to apply.

Canteens and Amenities

40. COMASC HABITAT is to determine canteen and amenities support in-country. LHQ is responsible for the provision of newspapers and periodicals (costed against OP HABITAT) to ASC HABITAT.

PART FOUR - FINANCIAL MATTERS

Appointment of Financial Adviser

41. A Financial Adviser (FAASC HABITAT) is to be appointed for ASC HABITAT to provide guidance to COMASC HABITAT, his staff and sub-unit commanders on matters of financial policy, funds control, estimates, financial and stores accounting systems and procedures.

42. Responsibilities of FAASC HABITAT are contained in Annex C.

Appointment of Financial Coordinator

43. Comd Sec Land Comd is appointed Financial Coordinator for ASC HABITAT. The duties of Financial Coordinator are contained in Annex C.

Financial Instructions for ASC HABITAT

44. Financial Instructions for ASC HABITAT are at Annex C.

RESOLUTION 688 (1991)

Adopted by the Security Council at its 2982nd meeting on 5 April 1991

The Security Council,

Mindful of its duties and its responsibilities under the Charter of the United Nations for the maintenance of international peace and security,

Recalling of Article 2, paragraph 7, of the Charter of the United Nations,

Gravely concerned by the repression of the Iraqi civilian population in many parts of Iraq, including most recently in Kurdish populated areas, which led to a massive flow of refugees towards and across international frontiers and to cross-border incursions, which threaten international peace and security in the region,

Deeply disturbed by the magnitude of the human suffering involved, Taking note of the letters sent by the representatives of Turkey and France to the United Nations dated 2 April 1991 and 4 April 1991, respectively (S/22435 and S/22442),

Taking note also of the letters sent by the Permanent Representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran to the United Nations dated 3 and 4 April 1991, respectively (S/22436 and S/22447),

Reaffirming the commitment of all Member States to the sovereignty, territorial integrity and political independence of Iraq and of all States in the area,

Bearing in mind the Secretary-General's report of 20 March 1991 (S/22366),

1. Condemns the repression of the Iraqi civilian population in many parts of Iraq, including most recently in Kurdish populated areas, the consequences of which threaten international peace and security in the region;

2. Demands that Iraq, as a contribution to remove the threat to international peace and security in the region, immediately end this repression and express the hope in the same context that an open dialogue will take place to ensure that the human and political rights of all Iraqi citizens are respected;

3. Insists that Iraq allow immediate access by international humanitarian organizations to all those in need of assistance in all parts of Iraq and to make available all necessary facilities for their operations;
4. Requests the Secretary-General to pursue his humanitarian efforts in Iraq and to report forthwith, if appropriate on the basis of a further mission to the region, on the plight of the Iraqi civilian population, and in particular the Kurdish population, suffering from the repression in all its forms inflicted by the Iraqi authorities;
5. Requests further the Secretary-General to use all the resources at his disposal, including those of the relevant United Nations agencies, to address urgently the critical needs of the refugees and displaced Iraqi population;
6. Appeals to all Member States and to all humanitarian organizations to contribute to these humanitarian relief efforts;
7. Demands that Iraq cooperate with the Secretary-General to these ends;
8. Decides to remain seized of the matter.
