Purpose

1.1 Regimental Standing Orders are written to provide policy and direction on the functions and routines of the 1st Armoured Regiment whilst in barracks. These orders will not regurgitate what is already contained in directives from higher Defence organisations but will refer to relevant sections of those directions.

1.2 Separate orders and instructions will be issued to cover training activities and deployments.

Legality

1.3 1st Armoured Regiment Standing Orders constitute a Lawful General Order. These orders are to be complied with, by all personnel posted to or attached to the 1st Armoured Regiment. The 1st Armoured Regiment Standing Orders come into effect on the date of issue and replace all previous standing orders issued for the Regiment. It is the individual responsibility of each member posted to or attached to 1st Armoured Regiment to read these orders.

Review

1.4 Review of the content of these orders is the responsibility of the Regimental Second in Command. This review is to occur at least once every two years to ensure content is current and relevant.

Chapter Sponsors

1.5 Each chapter is to be reviewed by the subject matter expert/s within the unit. The date of the review is to appear in the left hand 'Footer' of the first page of the Chapter. A list of chapter sponsors is contained below:

- n. Chapter 14 – Regimental Duty System – RSM.

Amendments

1.6 Amendments are to be made principally during the review process. Urgent amendments will result on the re-issue of the effected chapter. On receipt of an amended chapter, an entry is to be made in the amendment certificate in the front of these orders.

1.7 Amendments are to be authorised by the CO through the sponsors of each chapter. Suggested amendments are to be forwarded to the chapter sponsors.
