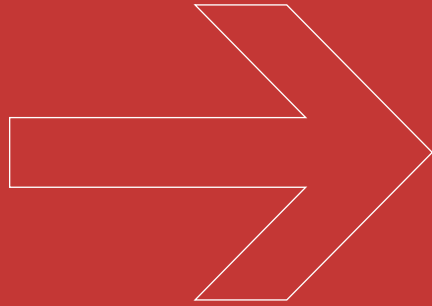

The Active and Standby Staff Group

The Active and Standby Staff Group (ASSG) is a Reserve Unit that was established in 2001 to provide a pool of part-time Army Officers and Warrant Officers to undertake sponsored projects and activities for the Army, Joint and Defence Organisations.

The ASSG is a Directorate within Personnel Branch - AHQ, and is located at Defence's Campbell Park Offices.

ASSG has an authorised establishment of 67 Project Staff Officers supported by a small headquarters group. Members of the Unit are mainly distributed in Australia's east-coast cities with Project Staff in Canberra, Sydney and Brisbane.

Additionally, ASSG has responsibility for managing 24 Reserve Augmentation Staff (RAS) positions in HCAST, DFJHQ, SOD, LHQ, AHQ and TC-A as a means of providing a surge capability to these headquarters.



The Role

ASSG's role is the provision of an active and standby Reserve staff officer capability for Army, Joint Headquarters and Defence sponsored projects and activities.
