SOLS meeting in Auckland is "Logistics Cooperation: Joining Forces with Industry", I have chosen a theme with a similar flavour "PACS: Promoting Better Industry-Government Relations".

At this stage Australia, Canada, New Zealand, Singapore and the United States will be giving presentations in line with this theme. I am also hopeful that several other countries will present case studies. It is planned that the Assistant Chief of Staff for

Logistics, Commodore Dato Adinan bin Rasol will officially open the meeting.

Early in the new year I will distribute the agenda for the meeting and a discussion paper on the aims and objectives of the PACS Forum. If any delegate has an item that needs to be included in the agenda, please forward it to me as soon as possible.

All PASOLS nations will shortly receive formal notification of the meeting from the PASOLS Secretariat.

Our Malaysian hosts will be making a group booking at the Legend Hotel in the centre of KL (only a handful of countries have confirmed attendance at this time). Cost will be about US \$100 per night including breakfast. The Legend has excellent conference facilities. The hotel is situated opposite the Putra World Trade Centre, Malaysia's largest convention and trade centre, and The Mall, a large shopping complex.
