EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

Defence Determination 2000/39

This Determination amends Defence Determination 2000/1, Conditions of Service (“the Principal Determination”), made under section 58B of the *Defence Act 1903*, which includes provisions dealing with deployment allowance and additional recreation leave for members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF) on deployment.

The purpose of this Determination is to provide for entitlements of this kind for members who have been deployed with the International Peace Monitoring Team in the Solomon Islands.

This Determination is to be taken to have commenced on 4 November 2000, the date on which the operational area took effect. The Determination was made as soon as practicable after that date.

Part 2 of Schedule 10 to the Principal Determination sets out the additional days of recreation leave which accrue to members who perform duty in a leave year at certain localities overseas in connection with a deployment with a United Nations (UN) mission or similar force. Members who perform duty in a leave year at these localities in connection with a deployment will receive up to 10 additional days of recreation leave, depending on the length of service in the localities in connection with a deployment. The amendment to that Part provides for the grant of additional recreation leave to members in the Solomon Islands.

Part 2 of Chapter 9 of the Principal Determination authorises payment of deployment allowance to members assigned for duty with a UN mission or similar force. Schedule 13 to the Principal Determination sets out the operational area associated with each deployment for the purposes of entitlement to the allowance. The amendment to Schedule 13 adds the Solomon Islands and the territorial sea of the Solomon Islands as the relevant operational area for the deployment of members as part of the International Peace Monitoring Team.

The retrospective application of this Determination does not affect the rights of a person (other than the Commonwealth) in a manner prejudicial to that person, nor does it impose any liability on such person.
