Travelling Allowance

Determination 3601, Travelling Allowance, is amended by inserting after clause 32 the following clause:

“32A. Subject to clauses 33 and 34, where a member referred to in clause 32 is accompanied by his or her family and the fares of the member's family are met at Commonwealth expense, Travelling Allowance is payable—

- (a) in respect of each adult family member and child aged 12 years and above—at a daily rate equal to the amount specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member; and
- (b) in respect of each child under the age of 12 years—at a daily rate equal to two thirds of the amount specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member.”

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

DETERMINATION NO. 25 OF 1988

ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

UNDER SECTION 58B OF THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903 allows the Minister to make determinations on conditions of service for members of the Defence Force.

Determination 3601, Travelling Allowance, provides for the payment of an allowance to a member proceeding overseas on duty to cover the cost of accommodation, meals and incidentals.

This determination amends Determination 3601, with effect from the date on which the determination is signed, to replace the reimbursement of the costs for meals which are taken by a member's family while en route to or from an overseas post with an entitlement to the allowance in respect of those family members. Under the previous provisions a member was required to retain all receipts and vouch for the applicable meals after the event.
