DETERMINATION UNDER THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

I, JOHN ELDEN McLEAY, the Minister of State for Administrative Services acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, hereby make the following Determination under section 58B of the *Defence Act 1903*.

1. This Determination may be cited as Determination 3999, Citation Southern Rhodesia Allowance.*

2. A member of the Australian Contingent, Commonwealth Cease Fire Monitoring Force, serving in Southern Rhodesia may be paid a Southern Rhodesia Allowance as follows:

- (a) members deployed in the field—\$8.50 per day; and
- (b) members attached to Joint Operations Centres, living in hotel, motel or guest house accommodation and in receipt of the United Kingdom Subsistence Allowance—\$3.50 per day.

3. This determination shall apply in relation to service by a Application member on or after 23 December 1979.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

DETERMINATION NO. 2 OF 1980

ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE MINISTER FOR
DEFENCE UNDER SECTION 58B OF THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903 provides that the Minister may make determinations on conditions of service which are beneficial to members of the Defence Force.

This determination provides for the introduction of a new allowance called 'Southern Rhodesia Allowance' to be payable to a member of the Australian Contingent Commonwealth Cease Fire Monitoring Force serving in Southern Rhodesia.

The allowance is designed to cover incidental expenses incurred by members. In addition, members who are deployed under field conditions are paid a higher rate of the allowance to compensate them for the difficult conditions in which they serve.

The date of effect is 23 December 1979 which is the date on which the first members of the Australian Contingent departed for Southern Rhodesia.

Pursuant to sub-section 58B(7) of the Defence Act 1903, Clause 1 of the determination provides for a method of citation additional to that prescribed in sub-section 58B(6) of that Act. The number 3999 which is part of the citation, is necessary for the purposes of identification, information retrieval and indexing.
