Determination under Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903

I, IAN MCCAHERN SINCLAIR, the Minister of State for Defence, hereby make the following Determination under section 58B of the *Defence Act 1903*.

Citation

1. This Determination may be cited as Determination 0197, Locum Tenens Allowance.¹

Definitions

2. In this Determination—

“dental officer” means an officer who is, or is eligible to be, registered as a dental practitioner under the laws of a State or Territory, and who is serving in—

- (a) the Dental Branch of the Naval Emergency Reserve Forces;
- (b) the Dental Branch of the Citizen Naval Forces;
- (c) the Dental Corps of the Regular Army Reserve;
- (d) the Dental Corps of the Regular Army Emergency Reserve;
- (e) the Dental Corps of the Citizen Military Forces;
- (f) the Medical Branch of the Air Force Emergency Force; or
- (g) the Medical Branch of the Citizen Air Force;

“medical officer” means an officer who is, or is eligible to be, registered as a medical practitioner under the laws of a State or Territory, and who is serving in—

- (a) the Medical Branch of the Naval Emergency Reserve Forces;
- (b) the Medical Branch of the Citizen Naval Forces;
- (c) the Medical Corps of the Regular Army Reserve;
- (d) the Medical Corps of the Regular Army Emergency Reserve;
- (e) the Medical Corps of the Citizen Military Forces;
- (f) the Medical Branch of the Air Force Emergency Force; or
- (g) the Medical Branch of the Citizen Air Force;

“pharmaceutical officer” means an officer who is, or is eligible to be, registered as a pharmacist under the laws of a State or Territory, and who is serving in—

- (a) the Medical Branch of the Naval Emergency Reserve Forces;
- (b) the Medical Branch of the Citizen Naval Forces;
- (c) the Medical Corps of the Regular Army Reserve;
- (d) the Medical Corps of the Regular Army Emergency Reserve;
- (e) the Medical Corps of the Citizen Military Forces;
- (f) the Medical Branch of the Air Force Emergency Force; or
- (g) the Medical Branch of the Citizen Air Force;

“reserve camp of continuous training” means reserve service for a period of not less than four consecutive days but does not include a course of training;

“reserve service” means service rendered by a medical officer, a dental officer or a pharmaceutical officer, as the case may be, other than service in respect of which he is entitled to be paid salary under the Defence Force (Salaries) Regulations.

3. The expression “sea-going ship” shall have the same meaning as in Determination 0203, Sea-going Allowance, made under section 58B of the *Defence Act 1903*.

Locum Tenens Allowance

4. An allowance called “Locum Tenens Allowance” is payable to a medical officer, a dental officer or a pharmaceutical officer who, while rendering reserve service, is required to pay for a locum tenens during the period of his absence from his civil practice.

Rate of Allowance

5. Locum Tenens Allowance is payable—

- (a) to a medical officer—at the rate of \$22.00 per day;
- (b) to a dental officer—at the rate of \$14.70 per day; and
- (c) to a pharmaceutical officer—at the rate of \$10.50 per day.

Conditions of Payment

6. Locum Tenens Allowance is payable to a medical officer, a dental officer or a pharmaceutical officer whilst rendering reserve service—

- (a) at a reserve camp of continuous training; or
- (b) for a period or periods, not exceeding in the aggregate a total of 10 days in any one year, at a military school, a course of training, a bivouac or in a sea-going ship or naval establishment.

Application

7. This Determination shall apply to a medical officer, a dental officer or a pharmaceutical officer who becomes a medical officer, a dental officer or a pharmaceutical officer on or before 31 December 1982.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

DETERMINATION NO. 60 OF 1982

ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE MINISTER FOR DEFENCE

UNDER SECTION 58B OF THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903 allows the Minister to make determinations on conditions of service which are beneficial to members of the Defence Force.

Determination 0197, Locum Tenens Allowance, provides for payment of locum tenens allowance to a medical, dental or pharmaceutical officer of the Reserve Forces who joined those Forces on or before 31 December 1982 and who is required to pay for a locum tenens during absence from his civil practice on reserve training.

Locum tenens allowance was previously paid under Naval Financial Regulation 280, Military Financial Regulations 184 and 201 and Air Force Regulations 645A(3) and 647(3). These regulations are repealed with effect from the date Determination 0197 is made.

The determination comes into effect on the date of signature.
