Determination under Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903

I, KIM CHRISTIAN BEAZLEY, the Minister of State for Aviation, acting for and on behalf of the Minister of State for Defence, hereby make the following Determination under section 58B of the *Defence Act 1903*.

Citation

1. This Determination may be cited as Determination 0195, Ceremonial Duties Allowance.

Definitions

2. In this Determination—

“member” means a member of the Reserve Forces rendering reserve service;

“Reserve Forces” means the Naval Emergency Reserve Forces, the Citizen Naval Forces, the Regular Army Reserve, the Regular Army Emergency Reserve, the Citizen Military Forces, the Air Force Emergency Force or the Citizen Air Force;

“reserve service” means service rendered by a member, other than service in respect of which he is entitled to be paid salary under the Defence Force (Salaries) Regulations.

Ceremonial Duties Allowance

3. An allowance called “Ceremonial Duties Allowance” is payable to a member who performs duty—

(a) as a member of—

(i) a firing party for ceremonial salutes;

- (ii) a guard of honour;
 - (iii) an escort for the Governor-General or a State Governor;
 - (iv) a ceremonial parade or funeral; or
 - (v) a band at a public performance by the band; and
- (b) on any other occasion approved by the person from time to time holding or performing the duties of the office or appointment titled First Assistant Secretary, Personnel Administration and Policy Division in the Department of Defence.

Amount of Allowance

4. The amount of Ceremonial Duties Allowance payable is—

- (a) in respect of a day on which the duties are performed for a period of not less than 3 hours—an amount equal to the amount of pay which would have been payable to the member if that day had been a day for which the member was eligible for pay under the Defence Force (Reserves) (Financial) Regulations; and
- (b) where the duties are performed for a period of less than 3 hours—one-half of the amount payable under paragraph (a).

Allowance Not Payable

5. Ceremonial Duties Allowance is not payable to a member in respect of a day on which he is entitled to pay under the Defence Force (Reserves) (Financial) Regulations.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT
DETERMINATION NO. 9 OF 1983
ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY FOR THE MINISTER FOR DEFENCE
UNDER SECTION 58B OF THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903 allows the Minister to make determinations on conditions of service which are beneficial to members of the Defence Force.

Determination 0195, Ceremonial Duties Allowance, provides for the payment of an allowance to members of the Reserve Forces who perform certain specified ceremonial duties for which they are not entitled to salary under the Defence Force (Reserves) (Financial) Regulations.

The Determination replaces regulation 278 of the Naval Financial Regulations and regulation 208 of the Military Financial Regulations.

The date of effect is the date of signature of the Determination.
