Defence Act 1903**

PART I—PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. This Determination may be cited as Determination 3601, Travelling Allowance.¹

Definitions

2. In this Determination, unless the contrary intention appears—
“accompanied”, in relation to a member, means a member—

- (a) whose family—
 - (i) travels to an overseas post at Commonwealth expense; and
 - (ii) resides with the member at the overseas post; or
- (b) who, while at an overseas post—
 - (i) marries; or
 - (ii) cohabits with a person to whom clause 3 of Determination 0114, Trainee’s Dependant Allowance, applies,and whose family resides with the member at that overseas post and will travel at Commonwealth expense from that overseas post;

“authorized method of travel”, in relation to a journey, means the method of travel authorized by the proper authority within the arm of the Defence Force to which the member belongs;

“Chief of Staff” means—

- (a) in relation to a member of the Navy—the Chief of Naval Staff;
- (b) in relation to a member of the Army—the Chief of the General Staff; and
- (c) in relation to a member of the Air Force—the Chief of the Air Staff;

“child”, in relation to a member, means a child (whether born in or outside wedlock), a step-child or a legally adopted child of—

- (a) the member;
- (b) a person who has ceased to be legally married to the member;
- (c) a person who has lived on a permanent and *bona fide* domestic basis as the member’s spouse;
- (d) the spouse of the member;
- (e) a person who has ceased to be legally married to the spouse of the member; or
- (f) a person who lived with the member’s spouse on a permanent and *bona fide* domestic basis as a spouse,

who—

- (g) is less than 21 years of age;
- (h) is 21 years of age or over and is, through illness or infirmity, wholly or substantially dependent on the member; or
- (i) turned 21 years of age on or after arrival at an overseas post and who travelled to that post at Commonwealth expense;

“corresponding rank” has the same meaning as in Determination 0104, Higher Duties Allowance;

“duration of the journey” means the period of a journey between the time of departure and the time of arrival based on the local standard time at the place of departure and the place of arrival assessed to the nearest hour;

“family”, in relation to an accompanied member, means—

- (a) one or more of the following persons who normally reside with the member:
 - (i) the spouse of the member;
 - (ii) a child; or
 - (iii) where the member is widowed, unmarried or permanently separated—a person acting as a guardian or housekeeper to a child; or
- (b) any other person approved by an approving authority under clause 4;

“Head of Mission” means a person appointed by the Governor-General as the Head of Mission in an overseas country;

- “Head of Post” means a person appointed under the *Public Service Act 1922* who occupies a Head of Post position in an overseas country;
- “intended”, in relation to a period of duty, means intended by the proper authority within the arm of the Defence Force to which the member belongs;
- “intermediate term duty” means duty in an overseas country for a period which is intended to be more than 6 months but less than 12 months;
- “language training course” means a course of training in a language other than the English language, undertaken by a member or his or her spouse in an overseas country at the commencement of the member’s long term duty in that country;
- “lives in”, in relation to a member, means that the member is provided with rations and quarters at the expense of the Commonwealth and “living in” has a corresponding meaning;
- “lives out”, in relation to a member, means that the member is permitted to reside in private accommodation and “living out” has a corresponding meaning;
- “long service leave” means leave of absence granted under Determination 2701, Long Service Leave;
- “long term duty” means duty in an overseas country for a period which is intended to be 12 months or more;
- “member” means a serving member;
- “most direct route” means the route approved by the proper authority within the arm of the Defence Force to which the member belongs as being the normal scheduled route for a journey;
- “other countries” means—
- (a) for the purposes of Schedule 1, a country other than—
 - (i) a country specified by name in Schedule 1; and
 - (ii) a country specified in the following list of countries—
 - Argentina
 - Brazil
 - Chile
 - German Democratic Republic
 - Iran
 - Luxemburg
 - Libya
 - Paraguay
 - Peru
 - Poland
 - Qatar
 - South Africa
 - Turkey
 - Union of Soviet Socialist Republics
 - Uruguay

- (b) for the purposes of Schedule 3, a country other than—
- (i) a country specified by name in Schedule 3; and
 - (ii) a country specified in the following list of countries—

Argentina
 Austria
 Brazil
 Burma
 Chile
 Denmark
 German Democratic Republic
 Iran
 Libya
 Malta
 Mexico
 Peru
 Poland
 South Africa
 Spain
 Turkey
 Union of Soviet Socialist Republics
 Yugoslavia

“overseas” means outside Australia;

“privately owned vehicle” means a motor vehicle owned, hired or borrowed by a member;

“public holiday” has the same meaning as in Determination 2601, Recreation Leave;

“recreation leave” means leave of absence for the purpose of recreation granted to a member under Determination 2601, Recreation Leave;

“rest period” means a period of rest granted to a member travelling en route to or from an overseas country or at his or her destination to permit the member to recuperate from the stress of travel before resuming the journey or before commencing duty at the destination;

“senior Service representative” means the senior Naval, Army or Air Force officer, as the case may be, representing the Department of Defence at an overseas post;

“Service aircraft” means—

- (a) an aircraft of the Defence Force;
- (b) an aircraft of the Armed Forces of a foreign country; or
- (c) an aircraft wholly chartered by the Defence Force or a part of the Defence Force;

“Service vessel” means—

- (a) a ship in commission in the service of the Navy;
- (b) a ship—
 - (i) of another part of the Defence Force; or

(ii) of the Armed Forces of a foreign country,
declared by the Chief of Staff to be a Service vessel for the
purposes of this Determination; or

(c) a ship chartered by the Defence Force or a part of the Defence
Force;

“settling in” and “settling out”, in relation to a member, have the same
respective meanings as in Determination 3711, Settling In and Settling
Out Allowance;

“short term duty” means duty in an overseas country for a period which is
intended to be 6 months or less;

“time of arrival”, in relation to a journey undertaken by a member,
means—

(a) where the travel is travel on duty between Australia and an
overseas country or between two overseas countries and the
authorized method of travel is by air—the scheduled time of
arrival of the aircraft;

(b) where the travel is travel on duty within the country of posting
and the authorized method of travel is by air—the actual time
of arrival of the aircraft; and

(c) where the authorized method of travel under (a) or (b) is by
means other than air—the actual time the member leaves the
carrier after the journey;

“time of departure”, in relation to a journey undertaken by a member,
means—

(a) where the travel is travel on duty between Australia and an
overseas country or between two overseas countries and the
authorized method of travel is by air—one and a half hours
before the scheduled time of departure of the aircraft from the
initial point of departure;

(b) where the travel is travel on duty within the country of posting
and the authorized method of travel is by air—the time at
which the conveyance provided by the airline is scheduled to
depart for the airport; and

(c) where the authorized method of travel under (a) or (b) is by a
means other than air—the time the member actually joins the
carrier for the journey;

“weekend” means Saturday and Sunday.

Interpretation

3. In this Determination, unless the contrary intention appears—

(a) the expression “*de facto* spouse” has the same meaning as in
Determination 0114, Trainee’s Dependant Allowance;

(b) a reference by name to a rank includes a reference to any
corresponding rank;

- (c) "spouse", other than in paragraph (c) or (f), second occurring, of the definition of child in clause 2 includes "*de facto* spouse";
- (d) the expression "appropriate to the member", in relation to a rate of Travelling Allowance payable to a member means the daily rate of Travelling Allowance specified in Schedule 1 or Schedule 3 whichever is applicable, according to the rank held by the member in column 4 or 5, whichever is applicable, which is opposite to the country in column 1, and where applicable, the locality within the country and the type of accommodation occupied by the member, in which the member performs duty or a rest period or overnight stopover occurs, the currency of payment in column 2 and the category of allowance in column 3; and
- (e) a reference to a Determination is a reference to a Determination made under section 58B of the *Defence Act 1903*.

Approving Authorities

4. An approving authority may approve a person as part of the family of a member for the purposes of this Determination, having regard to—

- (a) the reason the person needs to travel with the member to the member's country of posting;
- (b) the financial circumstances of the person;
- (c) the degree of illness or infirmity, if any, of the person;
- (d) the degree of dependency of the person on the member;
- (e) the role the person plays in the member's household; and
- (f) the relationship of the person to the member.

5. The approving authority shall be—

- (a) for the purposes of clause 4, 13, 14, 15, 16, 20, 21, 23, 27, 31, 40, 42, 44, 45, 46, 51, 58 or 59—the person from time to time holding or performing the duties of the office or appointment in the Department of Defence titled—
 - (i) First Assistant Secretary, Industrial Division;
 - (ii) Director General, Industrial Division, Service Conditions Branch; or
 - (iii) Chief Executive Officer Allowances, Industrial Division, Service Conditions Branch, Service Conditions A Section;
- (b) for the purposes of clause 21, 40, 42, 46 or 58—
 - (i) the Head of Post;
 - (ii) the Head of Mission; or
 - (iii) the senior Service representative,
 as the case may be;
- (c) for the purposes of clauses 4, 21, 23, 40, 42, 45, 46 and 58—an officer appointed by the Chief of Staff under clause 6; and

- (d) for the purposes of clause 64—the person from time to time holding or performing the duties of the office or appointment in the Department of Defence titled the First Assistant Secretary, Industrial Division.

6. A Chief of Staff may, either generally or otherwise as provided in the instrument of appointment, by writing signed by the Chief of Staff, appoint—

- (a) in the case of the Chief of Naval Staff—
 - (i) an officer who holds a rank in the Navy not below the rank of Lieutenant; or
 - (ii) a person holding or performing the duties of an office in the Australian Public Service which is under the functional control of the Chief of Naval Staff and for which the minimum salary is not less than the minimum rate of salary for an office of Clerical Administrative (Class 6) in that Service;
- (b) in the case of the Chief of the General Staff—an officer who holds a rank in the Army not below the rank of Captain; or
- (c) in the case of the Chief of the Air Staff—an officer who holds a rank in the Air Force not below the rank of Flight Lieutenant,

to be an approving authority for the purposes of paragraph 5 (c).

PART II—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE—MEMBER PROCEEDING OVERSEAS ON LONG OR INTERMEDIATE TERM DUTY OR ON SHORT TERM DUTY FOR A PERIOD NOT EXCEEDING 28 DAYS

Travelling Allowance

7. Subject to clause 8, an allowance called “Travelling Allowance” is payable to a member who—

- (a) travels on intermediate term duty or long term duty between Australia and an overseas country;
- (b) travels on intermediate term duty or long term duty from one overseas country to another overseas country;
- (c) on completion of intermediate term duty or long term duty in an overseas country, travels on such duty to another locality in that country; and
- (d) travels between Australia and an overseas country, or between or within overseas countries, on short term duty for a period not exceeding 28 days.

Rates of Travelling Allowance

8. Subject to clauses 9 to 15 inclusive and to clauses 32 to 64 inclusive, Travelling Allowance is payable to a member to whom clause 7 refers at the daily rate specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member.

Allowance Payable En Route

9. Travelling Allowance is payable to a member to whom clause 7 refers for the duration of the journey—

- (a) where the member is travelling en route from an overseas country to Australia and the time taken for the journey does not exceed 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the carrier arrives at the member's destination—at a rate equal to the rate of Travelling Allowance that would be payable to the member under Determination 0401, Travelling Allowance, if the member were making an authorized journey within Australia to his or her place of destination;
- (b) in any other case where the time taken for the journey does not exceed 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the carrier arrives at the member's destination—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member for the country of destination; or
- (c) where the time taken for the journey exceeds 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the carrier arrives at the member's destination and—
 - (i) where no overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare paid includes the cost of meals—at the rate equal to the sum of \$A9.00 per day and the cost per day incurred by the member in respect of meals purchased by him or her during short breaks in the journey where such meals are not provided by the carrier;
 - (ii) where no overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare paid does not include the cost of meals—at a rate assessed in accordance with paragraph (a) or (b), whichever is applicable to the member's destination;
 - (iii) where a scheduled overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare paid includes the cost of accommodation and meals—at the rate of \$A9.00 per day; or
 - (iv) where a scheduled overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare paid does not include the cost of accommodation or meals or both—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member for the country where the overnight stop occurs.

Member Living In Overseas

10. Where a member on short term duty lives in in an overseas country, other than a country referred to in clause 11 or 12, Travelling Allowance is payable for the period that the member lives in at a rate equal to the sum of—

- (a) the daily cost of obligatory mess charges, if any, incurred by the member; and
- (b) the daily rate specified in Schedule 2 according to the rank held by the member in column 3 or 4 which is opposite the country in which the member is living in column 1 and the currency of payment in column 2.

11. A member who lives in in Canada or the United States of America or a United States Service establishment in Guam, Diego Garcia or Kwajalein for a period in excess of 72 hours shall be paid Travelling Allowance for that period—

- (a) where the member is living in in quarters designated as “United States Services’ Bachelor Officers Quarters”—at a rate equal to the sum of—
 - (i) a daily allowance of \$US32.50;
 - (ii) the daily cost of compulsory room cleaning charges, if any, incurred by the member; and
 - (iii) the daily cost of obligatory mess charges, if any, incurred by the member;
- (b) where the member is living in in Service quarters in the United States of America other than in quarters designated as “United States Services’ Bachelor Officers Quarters” and is required to take his or her meals in a mess designated “an open Mess of the United States Services”—at a rate equal to the sum of—
 - (i) a daily allowance of \$US16.00;
 - (ii) the daily rate specified in Schedule 2 according to the rank held by the member in column 3 or 4 which is opposite the United States of America in column 1 and the currency of payment in column 2; and
 - (iii) the daily cost of obligatory mess charges, if any, incurred by the member; or
- (c) in any other case—at a rate equal to the sum of—
 - (i) the daily cost of obligatory mess charges, if any, incurred by the member; and
 - (ii) the daily rate specified in Schedule 2 according to the rank held by the member in column 3 or 4 which is opposite the country in which he or she is living in column 1 and the currency of payment in column 2.

Member Hospitalized

12. Where a member is hospitalized while on short term duty overseas, Travelling Allowance is payable for the period of hospitalization at the rate equal to the rate of Oversea Living In Allowance that would be payable to the member under Determination 3715, Overseas Living In Allowance, if that member were posted for long or intermediate term duty to, and were living in, in the country where he or she is hospitalized.

13. The approving authority may approve reimbursement of any continuing expenses necessarily incurred by the member while hospitalized having regard to—

- (a) the nature of the expenses incurred; and
- (b) the period for which the member is expected to be hospitalized.

Adventurous Training and Sporting Activities

14. Where a member proceeds overseas on short term duty for adventurous training, Travelling Allowance is payable at a rate assessed by the approving authority, having regard to—

- (a) a detailed itinerary and the transport arrangements in respect of the adventurous training;
- (b) the duration of the adventurous training;
- (c) the costs incurred by the member for accommodation, meals and incidentals; and
- (d) the amount, if any, provided as assistance towards the adventurous training through the Peter Stuckey Mitchell Trust.

15. Where a member proceeds overseas on short term duty to participate in a sporting activity, Travelling Allowance is payable at a rate assessed by the approving authority, having regard to—

- (a) whether the sporting activity is deemed to be an official representation;
- (b) the nature of the sporting activity; and
- (c) whether the sport has a broad level of activity or interest throughout the Services.

**PART III—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE—MEMBER
PROCEEDING OVERSEAS ON SHORT TERM DUTY FOR
PERIOD EXCEEDING 28 DAYS—TRAVEL ON TEMPORARY
DUTY WITHIN COUNTRY OF POSTING**

Travelling Allowance

16. Subject to clause 17, an allowance called "Travelling Allowance" is payable to a member who while posted for long term duty or intermediate term duty overseas—

- (a) travels overnight on duty away from the locality of posting but within the country of posting;
- (b) travels on short term duty for a period exceeding 28 days from Australia to an overseas country or between overseas countries; or
- (c) undertakes a language training course in accordance with clause 27.

Rates of Travelling Allowance

17. Subject to clauses 18 to 64 inclusive, Travelling Allowance is payable to a member to whom clause 16 applies, at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member.

Allowance Payable En Route

18. Subject to clause 19, Travelling Allowance is payable to a member to whom paragraph 16 (a) or 16 (b) refers for the duration of the journey—

- (a) where the time taken for the journey does not exceed 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the

carrier arrives at the member's destination—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member; and

- (b) where the time taken for the journey exceeds 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the carrier arrives at the member's destination and—
 - (i) where no overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare paid includes the cost of meals—at the rate equal to the sum of \$A9.00 per day and the cost of expenses incurred by the member in respect of any meals necessarily purchased by him or her during short breaks in the journey if such meals are not provided by the carrier;
 - (ii) where no overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare does not include the cost of meals—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member;
 - (iii) where an overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare includes the cost of accommodation and meals—at the rate of \$A9.00 per day; or
 - (iv) where an overnight stop occurs during the journey and the fare does not include the cost of accommodation or meals or both—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member for the country where the overnight stop occurs.

19. Where a member is travelling en route to or from a temporary place of duty in the United States of America or Canada, Travelling Allowance is payable for the duration of the journey—

- (a) where he or she travels by air and the time taken for the journey does not exceed 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the carrier arrives at the member's destination—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member for the locality at which temporary duty will be undertaken;
- (b) where travel is by air and the time taken for the journey exceeds 8 hours from the actual time the carrier departs on the journey to the actual time the carrier arrives at the member's destination—at a daily rate equal to—
 - (i) the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member for the locality at which temporary duty will be undertaken,less
 - (ii) an amount of \$US1.50 or \$CAN1.50, as appropriate, where the cost of breakfast is included in the airfare;
 - (iii) an amount of \$US2.50 or \$CAN2.50, as appropriate, where the cost of lunch is included in the airfare; and
 - (iv) an amount of \$US3.50 or \$CAN3.50, as appropriate, where the cost of dinner is included in the airfare;

- (c) where travel is by surface transport and the fare includes the cost of sleeper accommodation and meals—at the rate of \$A3.00 per day in respect of travel in the United States of America; or
- (d) where travel is by surface transport and the fare includes the cost of sleeper accommodation but not meals—at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member for the locality in the United States of America where the temporary duty will be undertaken.

Member on Long or Intermediate Term Duty in Singapore

20. Where a member who is serving on intermediate term duty or long term duty in Singapore is required to travel on temporary duty overnight to Malaysia, Travelling Allowance is payable to the member at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member for the locality in Malaysia in which the temporary duty will be undertaken.

Additional Travelling Allowance—Member Living Out in the United States of America or Canada

21. Subject to clauses 22 and 23, a member who is on long term duty or intermediate term duty in the United States of America or Canada who is required to be temporarily absent on duty away from his or her normal place of duty but within the United States of America or Canada and is required to live out during that period may be paid an amount of Travelling Allowance additional to the amount payable to the member under clauses 17 and 19 where the approving authority considers that such payment is justified having regard to—

- (a) the member's rank;
- (b) the costs incurred by the member for meals, accommodation, laundry and incidental expenses; and
- (c) the duration of temporary duty.

22. The amount of additional Travelling Allowance approved under clause 21 shall—

- (a) not exceed \$US5.00 or \$CAN5.00 per day, whichever is applicable;
- (b) not exceed \$US7.00 or \$CAN7.00 per week, whichever is applicable, for reimbursement of laundry expenses;
- (c) include laundry and incidental expenses incurred during weekend absences from the place of temporary duty; and
- (d) not exceed reimbursement of \$US3.50 or \$CAN3.50, whichever is applicable, for each evening meal.

23. Where a member's expenditure exceeds the amount payable under clause 21, the approving authority may approve payment of an additional amount, having regard to—

- (a) the location of the member's place of temporary duty;
- (b) the member's rank; and

- (c) the nature of the costs incurred.

Member Settling In or Settling Out at the Post or Living In at the Post

24. A member who—

- (a) is settling in or settling out at his or her normal place of duty; or
- (b) lives in at his or her normal place of duty,

and who—

- (c) is required to be absent on temporary duty in a place away from his or her normal place of duty; and
- (d) is required to live out at that place of temporary duty,

shall be paid Travelling Allowance at the rate daily rate specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member.

Member Living In at Place of Temporary Duty

25. Where a member—

- (a) is living in Service accommodation at a place of temporary duty in the United States of America or Canada while undergoing a course of training; and
- (b) is required to live out during a break in the course of training for—
 - (i) a period of 6 days or less; or
 - (ii) a period of 7 days or more and it would be uneconomical or impracticable for the member to return to his or her normal place of duty each day,

Travelling Allowance is payable at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member.

26. Where an accompanied member who is serving in Britain, the United States of America or Canada, is required to live in during a period of temporary duty away from his or her normal place of duty but within the country to which he or she is posted, Travelling Allowance is payable to the member at a rate equal to the cost per day of obligatory mess fees, if any, incurred by the member.

Member Undergoing a Language Training Course

27. A member who—

- (a) is undergoing a language training course for a period of 12 weeks or less in an overseas locality where there is no Head of Mission or Head of Post; and
- (b) is residing in hotel accommodation for the duration or part of the duration of that course,

shall be paid Travelling Allowance for the period he or she is residing in hotel accommodation in these circumstances at a daily rate equal to—

- (c) where a category B rate of Travelling Allowance is specified in Schedule 3 for that location—the daily rate specified in that Schedule which is appropriate to the member for the country where the language training is being undertaken; or

- (d) where a category B rate of Travelling Allowance is not specified in Schedule 3 for that location—a daily rate assessed by the approving authority having regard to—
- (i) the member's rank;
 - (ii) the actual costs incurred by the member for accommodation, meals and incidentals; and
 - (iii) the locality where the member is undergoing the language training course.

28. Where a member referred to in clause 27 is accompanied by his or her family, Travelling Allowance is payable—

- (a) in respect of each adult family member and each child aged 8 years and above—at a daily rate equal to the rate assessed for the member under clause 27; and
- (b) in respect of each child under the age of 8 years—at a daily rate equal to two thirds of the amount assessed for the member under clause 27.

29. Where the cost of meals are included in the fees for the language training course or in the hotel tariff, the allowance payable under clauses 27 and 28 shall be reduced by an amount equal to the component for meals included in the assessment of the rate of Travelling Allowance specified in Schedule 3 for the locality in which the member is undertaking the language training course.

30. Where a member to whom clause 28 applies is accommodated in hotel accommodation with kitchen facilities and no daily rate for such facilities is specified in Schedule 3 for the locality where the member is undertaking the language training course, the daily allowance payable under clauses 27 and 28 shall be reduced by one third of the amount assessed.

31. Where a member and his or her spouse are both required to undertake a language training course simultaneously at the same location overseas and where—

- (a) there is at least one child at the location who is under school age;
- (b) it is essential for the language training course to be undertaken by the member and his or her spouse simultaneously or it is more economical for the member and his or her spouse to undertake the language training course simultaneously;
- (c) every reasonable effort has been made to avoid or reduce child minding costs;
- (d) the language training course cannot be undertaken at the member's hotel accommodation; and
- (e) the language training institute at which the course is being undertaken does not provide child minding facilities,

the approving authority may approve child minding costs in the assessment of Travelling Allowance under clauses 28 and 29 having regard to—

- (f) the family circumstances of the member; and

- (g) the costs incurred by the member in respect of child minding.

PART IV—TRAVELLING ALLOWANCE—GENERAL CONDITIONS

Rest Period or Unscheduled Overnight Stopover

32. Where a member who, while travelling on duty to or from an overseas country—

- (a) is granted a rest period en route;
- (b) is authorized by a proper Service authority to break the journey for an overnight stop to attend a meeting or briefing; or
- (c) is caused to make an unavoidable and unscheduled break in the journey extending overnight,

Travelling Allowance is payable to the member for the duration of the rest period or stopover at the daily rate specified in Schedule 1 or Schedule 3, whichever is applicable, appropriate to the member.

Accompanied Member En Route through London or Mainland United States of America

33. Where a member is required to stay in London while en route to a posting in Britain outside London, the member shall be paid—

- (a) the amount of Travelling Allowance payable in respect of the member under clause 8;
- (b) in respect of each adult family member and each child aged 8 years and over—an amount equal to the amount payable under paragraph (a); and
- (c) in respect of each child aged under 8 years—an amount equal to 60% of the amount payable under paragraph (a).

34. Subject to clause 35, where—

- (a) an accompanied member is travelling by surface transport on intermediate term duty or long term duty in mainland United States of America en route to the locality of posting or from that locality on completion of a posting; and
- (b) one or more meals are not included in the fares for the journey,

Travelling Allowance is payable for the period the member and his or her family are actually travelling at the rate of—

- (c) in respect of each adult family member and child aged 8 years and over—\$US21; and
- (d) in respect of each child aged under 8 years—\$US13.25,

for each 24 hour period, or part thereof, of the journey.

35. Travelling Allowance is not payable under clause 34 in respect of any period of the journey to or from the locality of posting during which the member and his or her family are awaiting onward movement.

36. A member to whom clause 34 refers shall be paid an allowance at the rate of \$A3.00 per day in respect of the period of the journey referred to in that clause.

Member Required to Live In

37. A member who is serving on temporary duty away from the locality of posting, other than an accompanied member, and who holds the rank of Lieutenant Commander, Major, Squadron Leader or a lower rank, is required to live in whenever Service accommodation and meals can be arranged at an overseas locality.

38. Where a member referred to in clause 37 is accompanied by his or her spouse or family at the member's own expense and wishes to live out in a locality where Service accommodation is available, the member shall be paid Travelling Allowance under the conditions and at the rate which applies under this Determination to an unaccompanied member who lives in.

Higher Rate of Travelling Allowance Payable

39. A member who is entitled to Travelling Allowance under this Determination while he or she occupies a position to which a rank higher than the rank he or she holds applies, shall be paid Travelling Allowance at the rate applicable to that higher rank for the period he or she occupies the position.

40. A member who is travelling overseas with the Minister and who is required to stay at the same hotel as the Minister may be paid a higher rate of Travelling Allowance than the rate applicable to his or her rank under this Determination where the approving authority considers payment of the higher rate is justified having regard to—

- (a) the member's rank;
- (b) the type of accommodation arranged for the Minister and his or her party at the overseas locality; and
- (c) the reason the member is accommodated in the same hotel as the Minister.

41. A member holding the rank of Captain in the Navy, Colonel or Group Captain or a lower rank who is attending the Royal College of Defence Studies in London shall be paid Travelling Allowance during college tours at the rate applicable under this Determination to a member holding the rank of Commodore, Brigadier or Air Commodore, as the case may be.

42. Where it is necessary for a member who is the leader of a delegation visiting an overseas country to be accommodated in suite accommodation in order to have additional office accommodation, the member may be paid a special category B rate of Travelling Allowance at a rate determined by the approving authority having regard to—

- (a) the member's rank;
- (b) the duties of the member at the overseas post;
- (c) the suitability of any office accommodation available at the post; and

- (d) the range, suitability and cost of suite accommodation available.

Categories of Travelling Allowance

43. For the purposes of this Determination, the categories of Travelling Allowance specified in column 3 of Schedules 1, 2 and 3 fulfil the following functions in the countries to which they refer:

- (a) category A rates of Travelling Allowance are amounts payable in respect of expenses for accommodation, meals and incidental expenses incurred by a member;
- (b) subject to clause 45, category B rates of Travelling Allowance are amounts payable in respect of expenses for meals and incidentals where accommodation costs are met by the Commonwealth; and
- (c) subject to clause 46, category C rates of Travelling Allowance are amounts payable in respect of expenses for incidentals where accommodation and meal costs are met by the Commonwealth.

Variation of Category Rates

44. Where a member is accommodated in other than a hotel in a country for which category A rates of Travelling Allowance are specified in Schedule 1 or 3, as the case may be, a category B rate of Travelling Allowance is payable in respect of that accommodation at a rate equal to the lesser of—

- (a) where an “in serviced accommodation with kitchen facilities” rate per day is specified in Schedule 1 for that country—that daily rate;
- (b) where an “in serviced accommodation with kitchen facilities” rate per day is not specified in Schedule 1 for that country but such a rate is specified in Schedule 3—that daily rate;
- (c) where an “in serviced accommodation with kitchen facilities” rate per day is not specified in either Schedule 1 or 3 for that country but a daily allowance for meals and laundry costs is specified for that country in Schedule 2 to Determination 3711, Settling In and Settling Out Allowance—that daily rate; or
- (d) in any other case—a rate assessed by the approving authority having regard to—
 - (i) the member’s rank;
 - (ii) the member’s family circumstances; and
 - (iii) the costs incurred by the member for meals and incidentals for the member and, where applicable, his or her family,

or—

- (e) the cost which would have been incurred by the Commonwealth had the member occupied hotel accommodation at the appropriate standard.

45. Subject to clause 47, where a member is entitled to a category B rate of Travelling Allowance under this Determination and the member—

- (a) incurs the cost of accommodation;

(b) is charged by the hotel an inclusive rate for meals and accommodation;
or

(c) is charged for the accommodation on a bed and breakfast basis,

the approving authority may vary that rate of allowance having regard to—

(d) the costs incurred by the member for accommodation and meals; and

(e) the standard of accommodation used by the member.

46. Subject to clause 47, where a member is entitled to a category C rate of Travelling Allowance and he or she incurs the cost of accommodation, meals or other compulsory charges made by the hotel which are not reimbursed by the Commonwealth, the approving authority may vary that rate of allowance having regard to—

(a) the costs incurred by the member for accommodation, meals and other compulsory charges made by the hotel;

(b) the standard of meals and accommodation used by the member; and

(c) where it is necessary for the member to take full board accommodation and it is necessary for the member to buy meals elsewhere—the costs incurred by the member for such additional meals.

47. Where a member is entitled to category B or C rates of Travelling Allowance and he or she is accompanied at his or her own expense by a member of his or her family—

(a) on short term duty overseas; or

(b) on temporary duty overnight away from his or her normal place of duty,

any variation made to Travelling Allowance under clause 45 or 46 in respect of accommodation costs incurred by the member shall be based on accommodation for a single person at the standard used by the member.

Member on Short Term Duty Living Out for a Period Exceeding 28 Days

48. Subject to clause 49, where a member who is on short term duty overseas or who is on temporary duty away from his or her normal place of duty overseas, lives out in the same locality for a continuous period of more than 28 days, Travelling Allowance at the daily rate specified in Schedule 3 appropriate to the member for the country of duty is payable on and from the 29th day of continuous living out at that locality.

49. Where a member to whom clause 48 applies—

(a) proceeds on temporary duty to another locality;

(b) returns to his or her former locality of temporary duty within a period of 7 days; and

(c) was advised by a Service administrative authority prior to his or her departure on temporary duty that his or her absence would not exceed 7 days,

continuity of residence for the purposes of clause 48 is deemed not to be broken by such absence.

Travel by Service Aircraft

50. Subject to clause 51, where a member, other than a member travelling in a VIP aircraft as a member of a Ministerial party, travels on short term duty to or from an overseas locality or on temporary duty away from an overseas locality of posting in a Service aircraft, Travelling Allowance is not payable during the flight or for the period of a stopover en route of less than 24 hours.

51. Where a member to whom clause 50 refers is required to stopover for a period of less than 24 hours but that period extends overnight, the member may be paid a category C rate of Travelling Allowance in respect of that stopover of an amount assessed by the approving authority having regard to—

- (a) the member's rank;
- (b) the country in which the stopover occurs; and
- (c) the incidental expenses incurred by the member at the stopover.

Travel by Service Vessel

52. Subject to clause 53, Travelling Allowance is not payable in respect of travel by a member in a Service vessel.

53. Where a member to whom clause 52 refers, is required to live temporarily ashore overnight on duty in an overseas country, Travelling Allowance is payable for the duration of that temporary duty at the daily rate specified in Schedule 1 appropriate to the member for the place of temporary duty.

Extension of Duty Beyond 6 Months

54. Where a member who is serving on short term duty in an overseas country is notified that the period of overseas duty in that country will be extended beyond 6 months, payment of Travelling Allowance in respect of such duty shall cease on and from the date of such notification.

Calculation of Travelling Allowance

55. Unless the contrary intention appears, calculation of Travelling Allowance under this Determination in respect of travel en route to or from an overseas post, or to or from an overseas place of temporary duty shall be calculated on the basis of time taken from time of departure to the time of arrival by the most direct route between two places of posting or between the normal place of duty and the temporary place of duty, as the case may be.

56. Subject to clause 57, when calculating Travelling Allowance in respect of a period of less than 1 day, the amount of allowance payable is to be assessed in accordance with the formula—

$$\frac{A \times B}{24}$$

where—

A is the daily rate of Travelling Allowance payable for the journey under this Determination; and

B is the period of the journey in hours, and where the period includes part of an hour, that part shall—

- (a) if the part of an hour is 30 minutes or more—be deemed to be 1 hour; and
- (b) if the part of an hour is less than 30 minutes—be disregarded.

57. Where the rates of Travelling Allowance differ in respect of different parts of a journey, whether en route or at a place of duty, Travelling Allowance in respect of each part of that journey or duty shall be assessed in accordance with clause 56.

Additional Travelling Allowance

58. Where the total amount of Travelling Allowance payable to a member for a period during which the member is—

- (a) travelling en route to a new locality of posting;
- (b) living out at a place of temporary duty away from his or her normal place of posting; or
- (c) living out at a locality while on short term duty overseas,

is insufficient to cover meal or accommodation expenses incurred during that period the approving authority may approve payment of a higher rate of Travelling Allowance having regard to—

- (d) the member's rank;
- (e) the country, or where appropriate, the locality of posting and the availability of accommodation of an appropriate standard; and
- (f) the costs incurred by the member for meals and accommodation during the whole of the period of overseas duty.

Dual Entitlements

59. Where the spouse of an accompanied member—

- (a) is also a member; or
- (b) is not a member but is entitled to be paid travelling allowance under the *Public Service Act 1922* in respect of the same period and under similar conditions as the member,

the rate of Travelling Allowance, if any, payable to the member shall be assessed by the approving authority having regard to—

- (c) the rank of the member;
- (d) the family circumstances of the member; and
- (e) the rate of Travelling Allowance, if any, payable to the spouse of the member.

Allowance Payable When Member Entitled to Overseas Vehicle Allowance or Aircraft Allowance

60. Where, but for this clause, a member is entitled to payment of an allowance under this Determination in respect of an occurrence which entitles the member also to payment of an allowance under Determination 3732, Overseas Vehicle Allowance or Determination 0403, Aircraft Allowance, the

amount of the allowance, if any, so payable under this Determination is limited to the amount calculated in accordance with Determination 3732 or Determination 0403, as the case may be.

Allowance not Payable

61. Travelling Allowance is not payable—

- (a) to a member in respect of a period of temporary duty away from his or her normal place of duty where the member is not required to be absent overnight from that normal place of duty;
- (b) during periods of recreation leave or long service leave, or for weekends and public holidays which are contiguous with recreation leave or long service leave; or
- (c) to a member for any period or periods during which he or she is serving on short term duty with an Australian Contingent as part of a Multi-National Force.

Allowance Reduced

62. Where a member who is travelling on duty from Australia to an overseas country crosses the International Date Line which results in the actual time on a day of the member's arrival in the overseas country being earlier than the actual time on a day of the member's scheduled departure from Australia, the amount of Travelling Allowance payable to the member is to be reduced by the sum of—

- (a) \$A2 for each day of the journey; and
- (b) where the period of the journey includes part of a day, an amount calculated in accordance with the formula—

$$\frac{\$A2 \times B}{24}$$

24

where **B** is the number of hours in the period.

Existing Entitlement to Continue

63. Where a member, immediately before the commencement of this Determination, was entitled to payment of an allowance under regulation 152 of the Military Financial Regulations, he shall, while the circumstances prevail in respect of which the allowance was payable, continue to be paid the allowance.

Member Taking Part in Defence Co-operation Programme

64. Where a member is living in accommodation other than an hotel or motel while he or she is serving on short term duty and is taking part in a Defence Co-operation Programme or Project, the approving authority may approve payment of an amount of Travelling Allowance for the period or periods the member is living in such accommodation, having regard to—

- (a) the location overseas of the Defence Co-operation Programme or Project;

- (b) the expected duration of the period the member is taking part in the Defence Co-operation Programme or Project; and
 - (c) the type of accommodation provided.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

DETERMINATION NO. 99 OF 1984

ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE MINISTER FOR DEFENCE

UNDER SECTION 58B OF THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903 allows the Minister to make determinations on conditions of service for members of the Defence Force.

Determination 3601, Travelling Allowance, provides for payment of an allowance to a member proceeding overseas on duty to cover costs of accommodation, meals and incidentals.

The Determination replaces Military Financial Regulations 151, 152 and 153; Naval Financial Regulations 209 and 210; Industrial determinations under Naval Financial Regulation 105 and Air Force Regulation 633; and certain provisions contained in Air Force Regulations 645A and 647 and Military Financial Regulation 167.

The date of effect is the date of notification in the Gazette.
