### Overseas Rental and Utilities Allowance

1. Determination 3718, Overseas Rental and Utilities Allowance, is amended—

6. Determination 3901, Complementary Allowances Payable to Member Serving on Duty Overseas, is amended—

- (a) by inserting after the definition of “private motor vehicle” in clause 2 the following definition:

“‘representational funds’ means the funds allocated specifically to meet the costs associated with diplomatic, liaison and representational type duties;”;
- (b) by omitting from sub-paragraph 19 (b) (i) “entitled to Representation Allowance at an annual rate of \$1,000 or more” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds in excess of \$1,000 per annum”;
- (c) by omitting from paragraphs 55 (b), 153 (b), 158 (b) and 190 (b) “entitled to Representation Allowance” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds”;
- (d) by omitting from sub-paragraph 55 (e) (i) “entitled to Representation Allowance at an annual rate of less than \$2,400” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds of less than \$2,400 per year”;
- (e) by omitting from sub-paragraph 55 (e) (ii) “entitled to Representation Allowance at an annual rate of \$2,400 or more” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds of \$2,400 per year or more”;
- (f) by omitting from paragraph 56 (b) “annual rate of Representation Allowance payable to” and substituting “amount of representational funds received per year by”;
- (g) by omitting from sub-paragraph 62 (a) (i) and 62 (a) (ii) “entitled to an annual rate of Representation Allowance equal to or greater than the rate” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds the total of which is equal to or greater than the rate of Representation Allowance”;
- (h) by omitting from paragraph 90 (c) “entitled to Representation Allowance at an annual rate equal to or more than the rate” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds the total of which is equal to or more than the amount”; and
- (i) by omitting from paragraph 90 (d) “entitled to Representation Allowance at an annual rate equal to or greater than the rate” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds the total of which is equal to or greater than the amount”.

**Complementary Allowances Payable to Member Serving on Duty Overseas**

7. Determination 3901A, Complementary Allowances Payable to Member Serving on Duty Overseas, is amended—

- (a) by omitting the definition of “Representation Allowance” in clause 2 and substituting the following definition:

“representational funds’ means the funds allocated specifically to meet the costs associated with diplomatic, liaison and representational type duties;”;

- (b) by omitting from paragraph 17 (a) “entitled to Representation Allowance at an annual rate of \$1,000 or more” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds in excess of \$1,000 per annum”;
- (c) by omitting from paragraph 50 (b) “entitled to Representation Allowance” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds”;
- (d) by omitting from paragraph 50 (e) “Representation Allowance to which the member is entitled” and substituting “representational funds which the member is entitled to receive”;
- (e) by omitting from the table in clause 50 “Representation Allowance” (wherever occurring) and substituting “Representational funds”;
- (f) by omitting from paragraph 57 (b) “Representation Allowance, if any, to which he or she is entitled” and substituting “representational funds, if any, which he or she is entitled to receive”;
- (g) by omitting from the table in clause 57 “Representation Allowance” (wherever occurring) and substituting “receive representational funds”; and
- (h) by omitting from paragraphs 61 (b), 83 (a), 85B (b), 87 (b), 92 (b), 104 (a), 117 (b), 126 (b), 136 (a), 143 (a), 150B (b), 150E (b) and 174 (b) “entitled to Representation Allowance” and substituting “in receipt of representational funds”.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

DETERMINATION NO. 93 OF 1987

ISSUED BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE MINISTER FOR INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

UNDER SECTION 58B OF THE DEFENCE ACT 1903

Section 58B of the Defence Act 1903 allows the Minister to make determinations on conditions of service for members of the Defence Force.

Determination 3801, Representation Allowance, provides for the payment of an allowance to certain members of the Defence Force who are posted overseas for duties of a diplomatic, liaison or representational character. The allowance is paid to meet the costs of their entertainment responsibilities.

Paragraph 2(a) and clause 9 of this determination amend Determination 3801 by substituting the Schedule, from 1 January 1987, to:

- a. increase most of the rates of the allowance;
- b. introduce a new rate of allowance payable to members who attend the National Defence College in Canada or India;
- c. introduce a new rate of allowance payable to certain members associated with the New Construction Submarine (NCSM) Project Team who serve in France or Sweden; and
- d. introduce a new rate of allowance payable to certain members who serve in France, Papua New Guinea or the United States of America (USA).

Paragraphs 2(b) to 2(i) of this determination then amend the Schedule to Determination 3801 from the date on which this determination was made by:

- a. restricting payment, and by deleting the rates, of allowance payable to certain members serving in Germany;
- b. deleting the rates of allowance payable to certain members serving in France, India, Japan, the Philippines or the USA; and
- c. deleting all rates of allowance payable in the Netherlands or Pakistan.

Clause 3 of this determination revokes Determination 3801 as this allowance is now to be treated as an administrative expense rather than a personal allowance under Defence funding arrangements. Clause 11 applies this revocation from 1 January 1988.

Determination 3802, Entertainment Allowance, provides for the payment of an allowance to certain members of the Defence Force who are posted overseas, who carry some responsibility for the cost of official entertainment, but who are not entitled to the payment of Representation Allowance.

Paragraph 4(a) and clause 10 of this determination amend Determination 3802 by substituting the Schedule, from 1 January 1987, to:

- a. increase most of the rates of the allowance;
- b. introduce a new rate of allowance payable to certain members who serve in Papua New Guinea, Singapore, Sweden or Western Samoa; and
- c. delete the rate of allowance payable to the Staff Officer (Engineering) - Paris and to members who attend the National Defence College in Canada or India, as these members are now eligible for the payment of Representation Allowance from this date.

Paragraphs 4(b) to 4(m) of this determination then amend the Schedule to Determination 3802 from the date on which this determination was made by:

- a. reducing the rate of allowance payable to certain members serving in the USA;
- b. deleting the rates of allowance payable to certain members serving in France, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippines, Thailand, the United Nations or Western Samoa; and
- c. deleting all rates of allowance payable in China and Korea.

Clause 5 of this determination revokes Determination 3802 as this allowance is now to be treated as an administrative expense rather than a personal allowance under Defence funding arrangements. Clause 11 applies this revocation from 1 January 1988.

As a consequence of Determinations 3801 and 3802 being revoked, clauses 1, 6 and 7 of this determination make minor textual amendments to the following Determinations:

- a. Determination 3718, Rental and Utilities Allowance;
- b. Determination 3901, Complementary Allowances Payable to Member Serving on Duty Overseas; and
- c. Determination 3901A, Complementary Allowances Payable to Member Serving on Duty Overseas.

Clauses 8, 12 and 13 apply these changes from 1 January 1988.
