Commencement

2. This determination is to be taken to have commenced immediately after Overseas Defence Determination 1991/64 came into operation.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

DETERMINATION NO 92 OF 1991

Defence Act 1903

Overseas Defence Determination 1991/64 changed the basis of education assistance for members of the Australian Defence Force on long-term posting in the United States of America from designated schools to monetary amounts effective from 4 July 1991. Owing to an error in the methodology used to calculate the amounts, incorrect monetary levels were determined for primary and secondary schools on Manhattan Island. This determination amends Overseas Defence Determination 1989/27 by deleting the previous amounts and substituting new maximum admissible levels of expenditure for schools on Manhattan Island, from the same date of effect.

The retrospective application of this determination does not affect the rights of a person (other than the Commonwealth) in a manner prejudicial to that person, nor does it impose any liability on such person.
