**EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

**DEFENCE DETERMINATION 1994/34**

*Defence Act 1903*

Determination 2601, Recreation Leave, authorises recreation leave for members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF).

Clause 13 of Determination 2601 authorises additional recreation leave for members performing duty at remote localities within Australia and at certain localities overseas. The Table in clause 13 sets out the entitlement to additional recreation leave at those localities.

This Determination amends the Table to authorise the accrual of additional recreation leave at the specified rate for members performing duty in Mozambique and Rwanda as part of the ADF involvement in United Nations relief operations.

For other purposes relating to the administration of conditions of service, the Chief of the Defence Force designates an operational area. This amendment recognises service in that area for the purposes of accrual of additional recreation leave.

This Determination is effective from the day on which members arrived in the Rwanda operational area, which pre-dated the arrival of members in the Mozambique operational area on 8 August 1994.

The retrospective application of this Determination does not affect the rights of a person (other than the Commonwealth) in a manner prejudicial to that person, nor does it impose any liability on such person.
