1.1 This Determination may be cited as Defence Determination 1994/56.

2. Commencement

2.1 This Determination is to be taken to have commenced on 19 September 1994.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM
DEFENCE DETERMINATION 1994/56

Defence Act 1903

Determination 2601, Recreation Leave, authorises recreation leave for members of the Australian Defence Force (ADF).

Clause 13 of Determination 2601 authorises additional recreation leave for members performing duty at remote localities within Australia and at certain localities overseas. The Table in clause 13 sets out the entitlement to additional recreation leave at those localities.

This Determination amends the Table to authorise the accrual of additional recreation leave at the rate of 10 days a year for members performing duty in Haiti as part of the US Led Multi-national Force.

This Determination is effective from 19 September 1994, the day on which members arrived in Haiti.

The retrospective application of this Determination does not affect the rights of a person (other than the Commonwealth) in a manner prejudicial to that person, nor does it impose any liability on such person.
