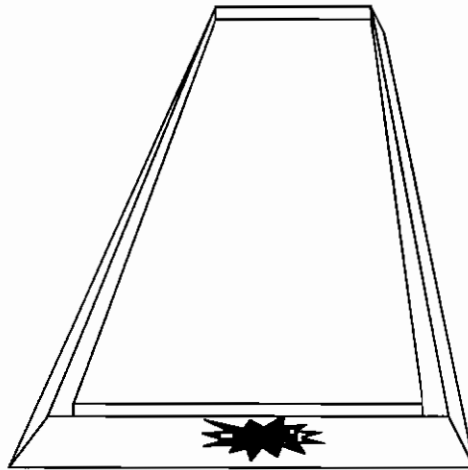

PLACING THE WREATH ON THE TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER



Notes:

1. The wreath (☼) is laid at the foot of the Tomb on the sloping glacis.
2. Personages in uniform should (unless their custom dictates otherwise) continue wearing headdress.
3. Once the wreath is laid the personage should step back and either salute or, if not wearing military headdress, pause and bow his/her head.

Biographies

The Honourable Stephen Smith, MP Minister for Defence

Stephen Smith was sworn in as Minister for Defence on 14 September 2010. Prior to that Mr Smith was Minister for Foreign Affairs and Trade from 28 June 2010 and Minister for Foreign Affairs from 3 December 2007.

Mr Smith was born in Narrogin, Western Australia and spent his early years in Narrogin and Southern Cross. He received his secondary school education at Christian Brothers High School Highgate in Perth.

Mr Smith is a Barrister and Solicitor by profession. He completed his Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Laws at the University of Western Australia. Mr Smith practised as a Barrister and Solicitor in Perth, then completed a Master of Laws at London University, and subsequently lectured and tutored in Law in London.

From 1983 to 1987 Mr Smith was Principal Private Secretary to the Attorney-General of Western Australia. From 1987 to 1990 he was the State Secretary of the Western Australian Branch of the Australian Labor Party.

During 1991 and 1992, Mr Smith was Special Adviser to the Prime Minister of Australia and Senior Adviser to the Deputy Prime Minister and Treasurer of Australia, Paul Keating.

Mr Smith has been the Federal Member for Perth since March 1993.

The Honourable Stephen Smith, MP (continued)

Prior to his appointment as Foreign Minister, from 1996 until 2007 Mr Smith held a range of Shadow Ministerial positions including Shadow Minister for Trade, Shadow Minister for

Resources and Energy, Shadow Minister for Communications, Shadow Minister for Health, Shadow Minister for Immigration, Shadow Minister for Industry, Infrastructure and Industrial Relations and Shadow Minister for Education and Training.

Mr Smith and his wife Jane live in the electorate of Perth and have two teenage children, a son Hugo and a daughter Madeleine.

Mr Smith enjoys watching cricket and hockey.

**General David Hurley, AC, DSC
Chief of the Defence Force**

General David Hurley was born in Wollongong, NSW in 1953. He graduated from the Royal Military College, Duntroon in December 1975 into the Royal Australian Infantry Corps.

In 1989 General Hurley served a posting as the Mechanised Infantry Adviser, Australian Army Project Team Malaysia. As a Lieutenant Colonel he assumed command of 1 RAR which he led during Operation SOLACE (Somalia) in 1993.

Following his command appointment General Hurley attended the United States Army War College, returning to a posting as Military Secretary to the Chief of Army.

He was promoted to Brigadier in January 1999 and assumed command of the 1st Brigade in Darwin, overseeing the Brigade's transition to a higher degree of operational readiness and its support to Australian led operations in East Timor.

From 2001 - 2003 General Hurley served as the Director General Land Development, Head Capability Systems and Land Commander Australia.

At the end of 2003 he was promoted to Lieutenant General in the role of Chief of Capability Development Group and in October 2007 was appointed Chief Joint Operations Command.

General Hurley was appointed to the position of the Vice Chief of Defence Force in July 2008. He was promoted to General and assumed his current appointment as the Chief of the Defence on 04 July 2011.

In 2010 General Hurley became a Companion of the Order of Australia for eminent service to the Australian Defence Force. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for his service in Somalia during Operation SOLACE.

General Hurley holds the academic qualifications of Bachelor of Arts and Graduate Diploma in Defence Studies. He is married to Linda and has three children.

Duncan Lewis is the Secretary of the Department of Defence. Building on almost four decades of experience in the defence and national security communities, he commenced in this role on 5 September 2011.

Born in 1953, Duncan joined the Australian Army after schooling in Western Australia, graduating from the Royal Military College, Duntroon in 1975. A career in the military, spanning 33 years, followed. During this time Duncan commenced in the Special Air Service Regiment and rose to the rank of Major General. He was awarded the Conspicuous Service Cross for his service in East Timor and appointed as an Officer of the Order of Australia for his service in command of Australian Special Forces.

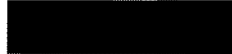

Baggage Handling Arrangements

Baggage should be available for collection by the hotel or vehicle baggage handler, at the time advised. Baggage must not be left in the hotel corridor.

Final acceptance of baggage is 45minutes prior to departure

Pre-flight Security Checks

All persons travelling by domestic airlines may be required to subject themselves and their baggage to the approved checking procedures.

Screening of Laptop Computers

During security screening on all domestic flights laptop computers must be removed from their carry case. The separation and reassembly is the responsibility of the passenger.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted on any Australian domestic flight sector, or in any Australian airline terminal.

ADMINISTRATION (continued)

Transport Regulations

Smoking is not permitted in transport provided or Australian Government vehicles. It is a legal requirement in Australia that seat belts be worn.

Conditions of Entry to Defence Buildings

No photographic equipment or materials which are capable of recording images are allowed into Defence Buildings.

This includes cameras (with or without lenses), mobile phones (with photographic abilities) video equipment or other photographic apparatus or material (eg film, plates, paper, video tape, etc.) (Note that mobile telephones cannot be taken into some Defence controlled areas)

Any telescopes, binoculars or any other long range optical instruments;

Any explosives, ammunitions, or firearms;

Any material or equipment capable of being used for audio recording;

Any radio transmitting equipment, except where attached to or carried in motor vehicles, in which case such equipment must not be removed from the vehicle or operated while in the area;

Any bulk computer equipment or bulk information storage media used with computers (eg magnetic media or compact disks).
