Stakeholders. Various stakeholders will need to be considered and engaged at various stages of a property disposal project. These are likely to include:

- Minister for Defence
- Parliamentary Secretary for Defence Support
- Minister and Department of Finance and Deregulation
- Minister for Housing and the Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs.
- Other Federal Agencies as possible alternative users of surplus Defence property.
- State Government equivalents.
- Local Federal Member of Parliament.
- Local City Council.
- Defence Housing Australia.
- Defence Capability Groups (as occupiers / sponsors of surplus property).
- Defence Chief Financial Officer
- Deputy Secretary Defence Support
- First Assistant Secretary Ministerial Support and Public Affairs (through DSG Strategic Communications Advisor).
- Head Infrastructure, Assistant Secretary Estate Planning, Assistant Secretary Property Services, Assistant Secretary Estate Policy and Environment, Director General Infrastructure Asset Development.
- Head Defence Support Operations including: Director General Regions and Bases, Regional Manager, Director Relocation and Housing.
- Defence Support Group Chief Operating Officer including: Director Balance Sheet Management.
