- ◇ I-10 South Pacific (Reconnaissance)
- ◇ I-26 Nouth Pacific (Rec.)
- ◇ I-60 I-59 arrived at Davao from Japan on Jan. 5th, 1942.
- ◇ I-53 I-54 I-55 I-56 I-57 I-58 arrived at San-Ya (HAI-NAN) from Japan on 27 Oct. 1941 and left San-Ya on Dec. 1, 1941.
- ◇ I-62 I-64 I-65 I-66 arrived at San-Ya on Dec. 2 then I-62 left San-Ya on 3, Dec. 1941 and I-64 I-65 I-66 left San-Ya on Dec. 5, 1941.

2 Imperial Japanese Navy's entire Operational Forces were ordered to open hostilities after at midnight on Dec. 8th, 1941, though Imperial General Headquarters Order No. 12.
