

**EXAMPLES OF SPONSOR MANAGED WORKS**

1. A new building is needed to house a historical collection under control of the Army History Unit. Army HQ, in the role of Sponsor, provides funding and 19 Chief Engineer Works is tasked to design the building, procure an appropriate contractor and manage the delivery of the works
2. Navy requires urgent modifications to a minor wharf facility. Navy HQ, in the role of sponsor, provides funding and engages a Project Manager/Contract Administrator from the Defence Infrastructure Panel, who oversees the wharf re-design, procures an appropriate contractor to manage the delivery of the works
3. An extension to an existing Q-store building is needed to better support governance management needs of an Army unit. The Army unit, in the role of Sponsor, provides funding and requests via internal process for an Army construction squadron to design the building extension (including procuring relevant structural design certification), and undertake the delivery of the works utilising its own tradesmen and equipment
4. An existing building occupied by Air Force needs internal reconfiguration to create additional office space via demolition and reinstallation of non-load bearing walls and associated electrical works. The Air Force unit, in the role of Sponsor, provides funding and requests via internal processes for an Air Force construction section to design the office layout, and undertake the delivery of the works utilising its own equipment and tradesmen including engagement of a licensed electrician
5. Headquarters Ground Training Wing (HQGTW) requires refurbishment of training rooms to support Gap Year. HQGTW as the Sponsor engages the EMOS or a contractor from the DIP to project manage, oversees the design and procure an appropriate contractor to manage the delivery of the works.
6. A Joint Logistic Unit requires the construction of a new loading ramp. Joint Logistic Command, in the role of Sponsor, provides funding and engages a suitably qualified Army Stand-by Reserve Engineer Officer on DA50 project work. The Engineer Officer procures a consultant to undertake the design of loading ramp and a contractor to undertake the construction
7. DOTAM, as part of E&IG but separate to the EWP, requires urgent refurbishment of a Classification range ahead of an international shooting tournament. DOTAM, in role of Sponsor, provides funding, but requests assistance from an Army construction unit to design and construct the works utilising Army tradesmen and equipment. The works are handed over from Army to E&IG via DOTAM
