NACC Project Approval on Track


NEW AIR COMBAT CAPABILITY


- White Paper (May 09) endorsed 100 aircraft buy
- Phased buy Phase 2A/B no fewer than 72 aircraft
- NACC 2nd Pass approved first 14 aircraft (Nov 09)

Phase 2A/B	Phase 2C (~2015)
• 3 F-35 Op Sqns	• 4 th F-35 Op Sqn
 Training Capability 	 Augment training

ANEF2025 in context

- WLM ANEF 2025 estimates noise impacts around RAAF Base WLM and SAAWR at 2025, and includes
 - JSF introduction
 - estimated growth in civil and military air traffic
- Noise exposure will gradually build until 2025
- Looking 15 years ahead is necessarily speculative
- ANEF 2025 uses the best available JSF noise and operations data
 - assumes all identified noise mitigation strategies are implemented
 - actual noise exposure will continually be refined as RAAF learns to operate the jet

Noise mitigation strategies

- WLM ANEF 2025 incorporates:
 - Power settings changed
 - Afterburner usage reduced
 - Flight tracks & profiles optimised
 - Simulation increased capability
 - Flight frequency assumed CONOPS
 - Deployed operations assumed CONOPS
 - SAWR use by JSF compared to Hornet reduced



Noise mitigation strategies

- Options subject to Government approval
 - Runway extension feasibility study Q2 2010
 - Concept of operations
- Other NACC & Defence activities
 - Engagement with local planning authorities
 - Noise land buffers
 - Development control planning
 - Communications PR and information plans
 - Noise monitoring systems installed to validate ANEF

Draft PER - Public Submissions

- 195 registered visitors at all information sessions
- 3000 website hits
- 70 submissions from Williamtown area (2 Darwin)
- 40 sources of submissions in Williamtown
- Feedback can be grouped into several themes:
 - Parameters of JSF operations, including flight paths, use of weapons ranges and runway length
 - Noise data, impacts & mitigation
 - Noise attenuation policy
 - Compensation & property values
 - ANEF, INM and NFPMS processes
 - Human health risks
 - Errors & terminology in Draft PER
 - Defence procedures
 - Public consultation process
- Positives: industry opportunity, economic benefits
- Negatives: noise, health & safety

- 2. Clarify sections of the Draft PER that have proved confusing or apparently contradictory
- 3. Correct minor errors in the Draft PER
- 4. Lessons learned from Draft PER process



- 1. Answers to questions raised by members of the public (where possible)
- Further health studies will be at discretion of DEWHA
- Alternatives to SAWR use by JSF are subject to further investigation
- Content of INM Data Report is not unclassified cannot publish
- Reasons for runway length selection for ANEF 2025
- Reasons for flight path optimisation
- Compensation not payable based on 'forecast' noise

- 2. Clarify sections of the Draft PER that have proved confusing or apparently contradictory
- The Draft PER is <u>not</u> the final environmental approval mechanism under the EPBC Act
- 'Discussion' regarding the value of insulation clarify context, and reinforce authority of local planning authority
- Terminology e.g. 'movement' VS 'flight'
- Defence processes e.g. public notification of SAWR use
- INM and ANEF processes

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3. Correct minor errors in the Draft PER

- Inclusion of additional sensitive receivers
- Removal of 'dB(A)' from ANEF/ANEC maps
- Reproduction of all affected maps and tables

(Note – some 'errors' highlighted in public submissions were the result of misinterpretation of drawings or TNIP)

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4. Lessons learned from Draft PER process

- Public consultation followed EPBC Act requirements, <u>however</u> more time should be allowed for public digestion of reports <u>prior</u> to information sessions being held.
- Noise is the greatest source of public concern regarding JSF operations.

Immediate Timeline of Activities

- **05 Mar 10 WCF**, presentation of public submissions on Draft PER
- Mar 10 Public release of Supp Report to Draft PER
- **Apr 10** Referral of JSF to DEWHA under the EBPC Act
- May 10 EIS/PER guidelines issued to Defence by DEWHA
- Jul 10-> Conduct of formal EIS/PER study
- Q1 2011 Public consultation on EIS/PER
- **Q3 2011** DEWHA approval / conditions issued to Defence
- Q3 2013 PWC approval for facilities construction
- Q3 2014 Commence facilities construction at Williamtown

Industry Opportunity

- Williamtown contributes just over \$1B per year directly and indirectly to the Newcastle economy.
- Over \$500M in facilities planned at WLM
- Currently 25 Australian companies provide support to JSF global production
 - ~\$230m total value to date
 - billions of dollars of opportunities in production & sustainment
 - local Newcastle firm: Varley Group- Support Equipment
- Australian JSF sustainment solution sees WLM as the sustainment hub
 - Deeper maintenance, training, warehousing, component support, coordination of national and global operations
 - HRAC: forum for engagement to optimise local industry opportunities
 - Lockheed Martin is engaging with local industry to assess viable production and sustainment work packages

Environmental Strategy

- Defence takes seriously its environmental obligations
 - Already engaged with DEWHA regarding requirements of EPBC Act
 - 2009 Draft PER was a voluntary Defence initiative
 - Further environmental study & consultation will be directed by DEWHA prior to any approvals
- Investment in environmental study & consultation is included in project schedule.
- Defence is committed to teaming with relevant authorities and engaging with the community to get the best possible result for all.
