

MAN HX77 FACT SHEET



What

The Rheinmetall MAN HX77 is the Australian Army's multi-purpose heavy tactical truck that can be configured for fuel, water, stores or with a flat-rack for general tasking. There are both protected and unprotected variants.

Why

The MAN HX77 truck features digital communications and a modular system for moving equipment and supplies quickly and effectively in support of troops and teams in the field. Modules can be tailored for specific missions, while variants fitted with armour offer protected capability. The protected vehicles can deploy into threat environments protecting occupants from small arms fire, artillery shell splinters, landmines and IED blasts.

The vehicle can ford water obstacles up to 75cm deep without preparation and 1.2m with preparation. It is powered by 400L diesel engine, has 4 axels, a top speed of 102km/h and accommodates a driver and two passengers.

When

The HX77 was introduced in 2019 alongside Rheinmetall's 40M, HX81 and 45M Heavy Recovery Vehicle, under Land 121 Phase 3B, which replaces Army's aging fleet of Unimog, Mack and S-Liner trucks.
