- 9. Advertising in Service newspapers. An advertisement reminding readers of IGADF's independence, as well as how to make a submission to IGADF, appeared in the most recent editions of all three Service newspapers. OIGADF advised the Minister's office before the advertisement's publication. The number of new submissions OIGADF has received since the advertisement's publication does not appear inconsistent with recent averages. Therefore, the advertisement's impact, if any, is unknown. The rate of submissions to OIGADF this calendar year continues to be higher than the previous historical average, demonstrating apparently ongoing confidence in IGADF processes.
- 10. 14th International Conference of Ombuds Institutions for Armed and Security Forces. As you are aware, Australia co-hosted last year's Conference. At the invitation of this year's co-hosts, two IGADF staff members are in Oslo, Norway providing guidance on proposed content and on contingency plans for online delivery should an in-person Conference not be possible. Participation in this international conference enables Australia to contribute to and influence discourse about effective oversight of armed and security forces' activities.








