

Program Intent

The Australian Defence Force Parliamentary Program, established in 2001 provides a unique opportunity for Senators and Members of the House of Representatives of Federal Parliament to walk in the shoes of our service personnel. The program was established to provide parliamentarians without previous direct military experience a practical experience of ADF personnel and capabilities, in order to facilitate a well-informed national conversation about Defence issues and expenditure. The intent of the ADF Parliamentary Program is to provide participants with an immersive experience regarding life in the ADF. The more participants embrace the program and involve themselves in the designated activities, the more insightful and rewarding the experience will be.

Exercise Talisman Sabre 2021 (TS2)

TS21 is the largest bilateral combined training activity between the Australian Defence Force (ADF) and United States (US) military. It is designed to test our respective forces in planning and conducting Combined and Joint Task Force operations and improve the combat readiness and interoperability between Australian and US forces.

Occurring every two years, Talisman Sabre reflects the closeness of our alliance and strength of our enduring military relationship.

TS21 is the ninth iteration of the exercise and consists of a Field Training Exercise incorporating force preparation (logistic) activities, amphibious landings, ground force manoeuvre, urban operations, air combat and maritime operations.

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, Defence is adjusting how it does business while still maintaining operational readiness. TS21 is critical to Defence maintaining that readiness. Defence has worked with relevant State and Territory authorities – including Chief Health Officers – to design an exercise that achieves its objectives while being safe for the Australian community and participating forces. The arrival of international partners for TS21 will not affect the number of returning Australians. TS21 demonstrates Defences capability to achieve large scale operational outcomes while concurrently dealing with a global pandemic.

Where: TS21 exercise activities are planned to occur in Queensland including in the Charters Towers region and ADF Townsville Field Training Area (TFTA); coastal locations including Bundaberg, Stanage Bay peninsular, ADF Shoalwater Bay Training Area (SWBTA), Mackay, Bowen, Proserpine, Ingham region, Lucinda, Forest Beach, ADF Cowley Beach Training Area (CBTA) and RAAF Scherger, as well as Evans Head in NSW.

Townsville will see increased military presence over this time, mainly at Lavarack Barracks and RAAF Townsville, and on the roads between there and Charters Towers.

When: TS21 will run from late June to mid-August 2021, this time frame includes the initial surge of equipment and people and their subsequent departure after the exercise. Exercise activities will peak during 18-31 July 2021.

Who: In addition to Australia and United States, personnel from New Zealand, Canada, the Republic of Korea, the UK and Japan will take part. France, India and Indonesia will serve as observer nations.

Commander Headquarters 1st Division and Deployable Joint Force Headquarters



Major General Jake Ellwood, DSC, AM

Major General Justin ('Jake') Ellwood assumed the appointment of Commander 1st Division/ Deployable Joint Force Headquarters in January 2019. He graduated from the Royal Military College — Duntroon in 1990 into the Royal Australian Infantry Corps. His early career includes platoon command in the 2nd/4th Battalion and operational service with the Irish Guards in Kosovo as Second in Command of a Warrior Company. Major General Ellwood commanded an infantry company in East Timor and served as the Brigade Major of the 1st Brigade.

Major General Ellwood was appointed Commanding Officer of the 5th Battalion from 2007 to 2008. During his tenure, he commanded a light armoured battlegroup in Iraq and a light infantry battlegroup in East Timor. Major General Ellwood deployed to Afghanistan as the Chief of Operations within Headquarters Resolute Support from 2014 to 2015. His career also encompasses diverse staff roles including Liaison Officer to the United States Marine Corps and Chief of Staff Headquarters Forces Command. Prior to his current appointment, Major General Ellwood served as Deputy Chief of Army. Major General Ellwood was appointed as the National Coordinator for the ADF response to Operation Bushfire Assist during the Black Summer of 2019/2020.

Major General Ellwood's personal awards include a Commander British Forces Commendation and a Divisional Commander's Commendation. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for his command and leadership in Iraq, a Commendation for Distinguished Service and the United States Legion of Merit (Degree of Officer) for his service in Afghanistan. Major General Ellwood was appointed as a Member of the Order of Australia in 2019 for service in multiple senior appointments within the Australian Army.

He holds a Bachelor and Master of Arts from Deakin University, a Masters of Management (Defence Studies) from the University of Canberra and a Graduate Diploma in Education (Secondary) from Monash University. Major General Ellwood is a graduate of the Australian Command and Staff College, Higher Defence College as well as a graduate of the Oxford Advanced Management and Leadership Program.

Major General Ellwood is married to Nicole. They have two children who are both Commissioned Officers in the ADF. Other than family pursuits, his hobbies include long distance running, military history, fishing and scuba diving.

Director General Joint Collective Training / EX TS 21 Director



Air Commodore Bellingham, DSC, AM, CSC

Air Commodore Bellingham, graduated from the Australian Defence Force Academy in 1989 with a Bachelor of Science. On completion of two flying postings at C130E and HS748, Air Commodore Bellingham completed Qualified Flying Instructor's (QFI) Course and served as a Flying Instructor. He was posted to 77SQN as the Forward Air Control Flight QFI in 1998 and was promoted to Squadron Leader as the 77SQN C Flight Commander in 2001. During this time he advocated the requirement for improved management of ADF Forward Air Control and Joint Terminal Attack Control and in 2002, Air Commodore Bellingham

became the first Commanding Officer of the Forward Air Control Development Unit. Air Commodore Bellingham was awarded the Conspicuous Service Cross for his leadership and dedication during this time in developing and establishing a foundation within the ADF for Forward Air Control and Joint Terminal Attack Control.

In 2003, Air Commodore Bellingham was posted to the Australian Defence Force Warfare Centre as the Staff Officer for Air Operations doctrine, immediately deploying as an Air Liaison Officer in the Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force supporting the Australian Special Operations Task Group in Iraq. He was awarded the United States Bronze Star in recognition of his contribution to the Joint Fires Element within the Combined Joint Special Operations Task Force. On completion of his posting to ADFWC, he was posted to 2SQN (E-7 Wedgetail) as the Executive Officer.

In 2008, he was promoted to Wing Commander and posted to the Air Land Integration Office (ALIO) as the Director. This posting saw continued advocacy for increased ADF focus on Air-Land Integration and remediation of the ADF Joint Fires capability. In 2009, ALIO was reformed under Joint Capability Command as the Air Surface Integration Directorate – Joint Fires with Air Commodore Bellingham appointed as the Director. During this posting, he undertook further tertiary studies and completed his Bachelor of Teaching with distinction.

In 2011, Air Commodore Bellingham was posted to Commanding Officer 4SQN. During his three years at 4SQN, the focus on Joint Fires and Air - Land Integration continued and saw 4SQN consolidate ADF Joint Terminal Attack Control, Forward Air Control - Airborne and Combat Control Team capabilities. In 2014, he was promoted to Group Captain and posted to the position of Director Air and Space Operations Centre in Headquarters Joint Operations Command.

In June 2015, he was temporarily promoted to Air Commodore for deployment as Commander Air Task Group 630 for operational service on Operation OKRA. Air Commodore Bellingham was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross in recognition of distinguished leadership and command during this deployment. Immediately following this deployment, he was posted as Officer Commanding 42 Wing until December 2017.

In 2018 Air Commodore Bellingham completed the Australian Defence Strategic Studies Course earning a Master of Arts (Strategic Studies). Immediately following this year, he was posted as Chief of Staff to VCDF until December 2019.

Air Commodore Bellingham has been awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, Member of the Order of Australia, Conspicuous Service Cross, Operational Service Medal (Middle East Region), Australian Active Service Medal (ICAT and IRAQ Clasp), Defence Force Long Service Medal, and US Bronze Star. He is married and has two children. He continues to enjoy his sport, in particular golf. Other interests include fishing, hiking and camping.

commander 3rd Brigade



Brigadier Kahlil Fegan DSC

Brigadier Kahlil Fegan graduated from the Royal Military College -Duntroon in 1993 to the Royal Australian Infantry Corps. He has served within the 3rd Battalion, 6th Battalion and the 8th/9th Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment.

His non-regimental postings include instructional time at the Army Recruit Training Centre; a two-year exchange to the Canadian School of Infantry; and a staff position within the Directorate of Officer Career

Management. Upon promotion to Lieutenant Colonel, Kahlil served as the Staff Officer Policy to the Chief of the Defence Force, and later as SO1 Force Preparation on the Headquarters of the 1st Division. After his command of the 8th/9th Battalion, Kahlil returned to the Division Headquarters as the Military Assistant to the Commander then as the Division's Chief of Staff.

Kahlil's operational experience includes deployment to East Timor in 2000 with the 6 RAR Battle Group; to Iraq in 2004 as the Officer Commanding SECDET III; on Operation QUEENSLAND FLOOD ASSIST in 2011 as commander Joint Task Force 637.10; to Afghanistan in 2012 as the Commanding Officer of the 8/9 RAR Task Group; and back to Iraq in 2016 as the Director of Plans for the Combined Joint Forces Land Component Command, Operation INHERENT RESOLVE.

Kahlil holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Newcastle; a Masters of Management Studies from the University of New South Wales; and a Masters of International Public Policy from Johns Hopkins University, School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS).

He is a graduate of the Australian Command and Staff College, and the Australian Institute of Company Directors Course.

In 2005 Kahlil was awarded a Commendation for Distinguished Service for his command of SECDET III in Iraq. In 2013 he was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross for his command of the Task Group in Afghanistan, and in 2018 he was awarded a Commendation for Distinguished Service for his time as Director of Plans in Iraq.

Kahlil is married to Ilona and they have a young son Elijah as well as two daughters, Caitlin and Lauren from a previous marriage.

Dress

As the activity is conducted within a number of other agencies there is no requirement to wear uniform for this activity.

Civilian

The ADF has minimum dress standards for on base and when dining in messes. When selecting civilian clothing for wear in Officer and Senior Non Commissioned Officers messes, smart casual clothing in line with contemporary standards is acceptable.

Ablution Blocks

Defence accommodation is often unisex as such the minimum clothing items that may be worn by both male and female personnel is a singlet and shorts or conservative dressing gown Under no circumstances are participants to move between their room and the ablutions wrapped in/wearing a towel on its own.

Physical Training

The minimum dress requirement for physical training: T-Shirt, Shorts, (shorts to be worn over lycra – bike pants) Socks, Running shoes and a hat.

Working Routine

The daily working routine is often long and physically demanding with attachment options designed to ensure you gain the maximum impact from the experience. Wherever possible, you will have the opportunity to work and live alongside servicemen and women at all rank levels. Nor is it an endurance test, so the prospect of arduous physical activity and conditions should not deter you from gaining the maximum from the Program. Host units can and will tailor the conditions to suit individual abilities to ensure participants get the most out of the experience.

Physical Training

The decision to participate in group physical training is voluntary; if participants choose to join ADF members in physical training, you will be under the instruction of a qualified physical training (PT) supervisor. Please discuss any limitations you may have with the PT Supervisor prior to the activity, who should provide advice on participation in the activity.

Additional Equipment

Any additional military equipment required throughout the program will be provided on loan to you for the duration of the activity. As per the program intent, there may not be five-star comforts or the protocols of a VIP visit as the aim of the program is to integrate participants into the daily working of the ADF. The following personal items are advisable:

- Toiletries, Own towel
- Thongs (to wear in communal showers)

Meals and Accommodation

All meals and accommodation will be provided by Defence for the duration of the program. Participants will be accommodated with ADF personnel and, where possible, provided with a single room.

Dietary Requirements

Meals prepared in Defence messes are prepared in bulk and in areas with foods which may cause food allergy or intolerance in some people. If participants have any dietary requirements please notify XO ADFPP prior to the program commencing. With sufficient notification the catering staff will make every effort to meet the specified dietary requirement.

Medical

Defence has an obligation to provide health care to parliamentarians participating in ADFPP options. To minimise the risk of adverse health outcomes, participants are required to meet an adequate standard of medical fitness and functional ability prior to participation.

Participation in the ADFPP should not be seen as an endurance test. All participation in any arduous physical activity is voluntary and participants should only engage in activities which they feel comfortable. Please inform the program host of any medical restrictions which may prevent participation in an activity.

Medication

Please bring any medication required for the period of the program. Please discuss any storage requirements with the program host.

Operational Security

Operational security is a key factor in ensuring the safety of all participants along with ADF personnel throughout the attachment. Prior to the activity please do not make public any details relating to the visit or share your movements, or those of other option participants, with anyone who do not have an absolute need to know.

Mobile phones and Personal Electronic Devices

Due to rapid technological advancement and enhancement of capabilities that can compromise security, mobile phones and Personal Electronic Devices (PEDs) represent a unique security challenge. PEDs have the capability to capture, store, receive and transmit information in various formats over fixed and wireless networks which may compromise the security of the environment being visited.

Mobile phones and PEDs are an essential component of communication; however they represent a potential security threat and, as such, are not to be taken into sensitive areas. The host officer will advise participants of these areas and devices are to be secured using the PED lockers provided.

Photography

Photography or video recording is prohibited on Defence establishments unless specifically authorised. Defence understands that participants may wish to have a memento of the program, so please ask the program host for permission to take a photograph. If participants are not permitted to use a personal device, the program host may be able arrange for a unit camera / photographer.

Any photographs you take will need to be cleared by your hosts, to ensure there is no sensitive items in the background, such as equipment control panels, access points or weaponry.

Please ask your hosts if the images are fine to post in the public domain and it is requested that any images or your participation in the activity is not made public until the activity has concluded.

Defence Values

The Defence Values and Behaviours have a strong foundation in the values that have come before. They are distilled from the history, the institutions and the people who have served before us in the ADF and Defence APS. The new Defence Values are not dissimilar to the previous values the Services, ADFA and APS have had over the years, but they are more than a replacement – they bring us alignment and a single purpose.

The Defence Values centre on the virtues of human character that apply to all of us, no matter where we work or live.

The Defence Values – "Our Values" – are:

- Service. The selflessness of character to place the security and interests of our nation and its people ahead of my own.
- Courage. The strength of character to say and do the right thing, always, especially in the face of adversity.
- Respect. The humanity of character to value others and treat them with dignity.
- Integrity. The consistency of character to align my thoughts, words and actions to do what is right.
- Excellence. The willingness of character to strive each day to be the best I can be, both professionally and personally.

The Defence Values are underpinned by new Defence Behaviours, which replace the 'One Defence Leadership Behaviours' and all other Group and Service behavioural sets.

Defence Behaviours

To live the Defence Values, I will:

- Act with purpose for Defence and the nation.
- Be adaptable, innovative and agile.
- Collaborate and be team-focused.
- Be accountable and trustworthy.
- Reflect, learn and improve.
- Be inclusive and value others.

Your conduct as an elected member of parliament will be on display at all times whilst participating in this ADFPP option, as such it is a Defence expectation that your conduct is appropriate and respectful of the Defence values throughout the activity.

Safety

Defence is committed to providing the safest possible environment for all Defence personnel, contractors, sub-contractors, and visitors. ADFPP participants will be provided with safety and security briefing and the commencement of the option and during the option.

It is a Defence expectation that participants agree to abide to reasonable directions and requests to minimise any risk to themselves and/or Defence personnel or property during an attachment. Participants are responsible for conducting themselves in a manner that will ensure their safety and the safety of others.

ADF PARLIAMENTARY PROGRAM – PROVISION OF ATTACHMENT OPTIONS

References:

INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Australian Defence Force Parliamentary Program (ADFPP), established in 2001, provides a unique opportunity for Senators and Members of Parliament to walk in the shoes of our service personnel. The program provides a unique opportunity for elected members of Parliament to gain an insight into the day-to-day workings of the ADF, and the complexities associated with defending Australia and its national interests.
- 2. The objectives of the ADFPP include providing participants with practical experiences of the ADF in order to facilitate a well-informed national conversation about Defence issues and expenditure. Opportunities and intended outcomes include:
- a. Enhancing understanding of a variety of ADF roles and missions.
- b. Enhancing understanding of ADF capability, from raise, train and sustain roles, and provision of joint capabilities, through to operations and major exercise activities.
- c. Experiencing life as a service person, including where possible, wearing the ADF uniform of the day and working and living alongside ADF personnel in their day-to-day activities.
- d. Enhancing awareness and understanding of ADF personnel and management issues.
- e. Gaining first-hand insights into the application of Defence capabilities in meeting the strategic aims of government.
- 3. The ADFPP also includes an Exchange element, whereby selected ADF personnel are attached to the office of a Senator or Member during a parliamentary sitting week. The aim of the Exchange program is to provide ADF members with greater insight into the workings of Parliament and the Westminster system of government.

AIM

4. The aim of this Directive is to detail the development of suitable attachment options and the selection of ADF personnel to participate in the parliamentary exchange.

OVERSIGHT AND ACCOUNTABILITY

- 5. MINDEF and the CDF together accept responsibility for the implementation of the ADFPP. MINDEF has appointed MINDP to sponsor the program within Parliament. VCDF is appointed to administer the program within Defence.
- 6. Director General Military Strategic Effects (DGMSE) is appointed as the lead for the ADFPP. The day-to-day administration and coordination of the program is the responsibility of the Executive Officer ADFPP (XO ADFPP).
- 7. Each Group Headquarters is to appoint a suitable ADFPP Coordinator as the principal point of contact between XO ADFPP and the Headquarters.
- 8. A defence advisor within the office of MINDP (O/MINDP) is the principal point of contact between the XO ADFPP and O/MINDP, and is able to facilitate, assist and provide advice regarding working with parliamentarians on ADFPP matters.

ATTACHMENT OPTIONS

Responsibilities

- 9. In line with internal processes and broad guidance from the ADFPP lead, Service Headquarters, Headquarters Joint Operations Command (HQJOC), and Joint Capabilities Group (JCG) are to submit attachment options to XO ADFPP NLT 1 October each year for delivery the following year.
- 10. Service Headquarters are to submit a minimum of four attachment options, while HQJOC and JCG are to submit a minimum of three attachment options.

Development

- 11. Attachment options should be designed to:
- a. Highlight 'who we are', 'what we do' and 'where we are going', and aim to expose parliamentarians to as many ADF capabilities and personnel as practicable.
- b. Be 'hands-on' alongside ADF personnel at the working level, and provide exposure to the different messing and accommodation environments, where possible.
- c. Emphasise ADF priorities and strategic themes.
- Provide a diverse and innovative experience.
- 12. VCDF is responsible for ensuring ADFPP options meet the objectives of the ADFPP and present a balanced choice and a diverse exposure to Defence activities.

13. A draft program for each option is to be developed and provided to XO ADFPP for review NLT one month prior to commencement.

ADFPP Yearly Brochure

- 14. A yearly brochure is to be produced by XO ADFPP and forwarded to all elected members of Federal Parliament prior to the ADFPP annual launch in February of each year. The brochure is to provide:
- a. details of all options available for the year
- b. VCDF and MINDP welcome messages
- c. information on:
 - (1) application and selection processes
 - (2) medical requirements specific to each option
 - (3) working routine
 - (4) Defence code of conduct/expectations
 - (5) uniforms
 - (6) administrative arrangements
 - (7) operations security
- d. details of the ADF Parliamentary Exchange
- e. an outline of the ADFPP Dining In Night.

Changes to Options

- 15. If an attachment needs to be cancelled or changed for any reason following its inclusion in the program, DGMSE must be informed as soon as possible to ensure minimal disruption. A revised option that meets the objective of the program is to be developed and cleared by DGMSE. XO ADFPP is responsible for advising affected Senators and Members and coordinating a suitable alternative.
- 16. All costs relating to the cancelled option and the new option are to be borne by the responsible Service/Group.

Considerations

- 17. **Timing.** Options are to be deliverable during the primary parliamentary recess periods of autumn (April); winter (July); and spring (late September / early October).
- 18. **Duration.** The optimum length of an option is three to five days for Units/Establishments, commencing on a Monday. Options that include operations and exercises, or where greater participation is required to fully gain the experience (such as the

Young Endeavour Youth Scheme and Middle East Options), should be a maximum of ten days, where possible.

- 19. **Participant Numbers.** The number of participants that can be accommodated must be decided when preparing the option, to ensure participants are provided an immersive experience regarding life in the ADF. The more participants are able to embrace the program and involve themselves in the designated activities, the more insightful and rewarding the experience will be for all involved.
- 20. **Medical.** When developing options, consideration should be given to public medical standards. Service/Group HQs are responsible for ensuring appropriate medical protocols are met prior to parliamentarians undertaking an option. XO ADFPP is to be informed of any option activities that require participants to undergo a physical examination, and this information is to be included in the ADFPP annual brochure.
- 21. XO ADFPP is responsible for coordinating the completion of all medical questionnaires and physical examinations and providing the necessary details to relevant HQ staff. Where there is doubt regarding an applicant's medical ability to undertake an option, the HQ senior medical officer is required to review the circumstances and provide clearance for the Senator or Member to participate in the option. Participants are responsible for any cost relating to physical examinations provided by civilian medical providers.
- 22. **Security.** Members and Senators of the Commonwealth are not required to hold a security clearance to access Australian Government security classified information while exercising the duties of the office, IAW reference A, para 6.3. This should be considered and consulted with the command security advisor in the development of ADFPP options.
- 23. Work Health Safety. The Commonwealth accepts the legal risks associated with parliamentarians participating in ADFPP options. As with all Defence activities, the health and safety of participants and ADF personnel is paramount. Prior to commencing any ADFPP option, parliamentarians will be required to agree to abide with reasonable directions and requests in order to minimise any risk of injury or adverse effects to themselves, Defence personnel or property. Escorts / hosts are to ensure that participants receive unit/workplace induction, including information in relation to Whole of Base (WoB) safety hazards and emergency management.
- 24. **Operations Security (OPSEC).** Vigilance is to be applied to the maintenance of OPSEC during ADFPP visit planning and conduct. While it is acknowledged that there are difficulties in planning and communicating across multiple systems and agencies, staff must protect information that may compromise OPSEC in order to minimise the risk to the ADFPP participants and the wider mission. In general, the ADFPP participants (with exception of the Escorting Officers) should not be named in signal messaging. Distribution of visit details (including itinerary) is to be limited to those with a need to know and classified as SECRET where practicable.
- 25. **OPSEC Briefings.** ADFPP participants are to be briefed on the requirement for them to protect information that may compromise OPSEC, particularly the importance of not broadcasting movements or identifying other participants.

Assimilation

- 26. **Initial Briefing.** To facilitate the process of assimilation leading into an attachment, ADFPP participants are to receive an initial welcome to the program and an overview briefing about the attachment, including the administrative requirements for the option. This initial brief will be conducted by XO ADFPP with relevant HQ staff during the sitting period prior to the attachment.
- 27. Clothing Issue. An integral part of the assimilation of ADFPP participants is the issue of appropriate working dress of the day. The issue of disruptive pattern uniforms and boots is to be coordinated by XO ADFPP during the sitting period prior to the attachment, utilising Canberra clothing stores.
- 28. **Ballistic Glasses.** XO ADFPP is to arrange for the prescription insert to be provided to participants. Participants are responsible for obtaining the prescription insert lenses from their optometrist.
- 29. **ADFPP Insignia.** ADFPP participants are issued with distinctive ADFPP insignia slides and cap to be worn with uniform whilst undertaking the attachment. XO ADFPP is to provide participants with the insignia during their initial briefing.

Conduct

- 30. **Briefings.** Hosts are to brief participants at the commencement of a program. Briefings are to include an overview of the activities and safety and security information in accordance with departmental, regional and local base induction policy guidelines.
- 31. Additional Equipment. Due to the nature of attachments, any additional equipment required by participants is to be provided on loan by the conducting unit.
- 32. **Escorts.** Escort officer/s will generally be assigned by the HQ or unit to assist with administration and liaison duties during the attachment. The escort officer/s should be of suitable rank and experience to provide participants with an appreciation of strategic guidance during the activities.
- 33. **Base Access.** ADFPP participants are not issued with Defence ID/Common Access Cards. All base access and passes are to be arranged by the conducting unit.
- 34. **Photography**. IAW reference B, photography or video recording is prohibited on Defence establishments unless specifically authorised. It is understandable that participants may wish to have a memento of the program. To ensure that only cleared photographs are provided to participants, the program host should arrange for a unit camera/photographer to capture participants' experiences on the program. Photographs provided to participants are to be in accordance with reference C. Imagery is also to be forwarded to XO ADFPP.
- 35. **Public Affairs Support**. Where public affairs support is provided to the activity, a package of no more than 40 photos should be cleared and provided to the participants.
- 36. **Exit Interview / Feedback.** Hosts are to conduct an exit interview with participants to allow meaningful feedback to be exchanged by both parties. The results of the exit

interview should comprise part of an overall Post-Activity Report (PAR) to be compiled by the option host and forwarded to XO ADFPP through HQ Coordinators. PARs are to be submitted within 30 days of the completion of the option. ADFPP participants will be invited to provide additional feedback to XO ADFPP on their experience – this feedback will be passed on to the HQ Coordinators once received.

ADFPP EXCHANGE PROGRAM

- 37. **Outline**. The ADFPP conducts an Exchange element of the program whereby ADF personnel are hosted by parliamentarians at Parliament House during a sitting week to observe the workings of Government and participate in the daily work schedule of an individual parliamentarian. Participants are provided a unique insight into the conduct of Federal Parliament and the valuable work undertaken by their host, particularly in relation to committee processes.
- 38. **Hosts**. The selection and coordination of hosts is managed by the Defence Advisor to O/MINDP.
- 39. **Selection Criteria**. Participants are to be carefully selected from across the ranks and be representative of the ADF's future leaders, be highly suitable for representational duties and not subject to administrative or disciplinary action.
- 40. **Responsibilities**. In accordance with internal processes, Service HQs and JOC should nominate three ADF members and one reserve. JCG and VCDF Executive should nominate two ADF members and one reserve.

RESOURCING

- 41. The ADFPP has no dedicated funding line to support attachment options. Service and Group HQ are required to cover the full cost of their proposed programs, including any changes made to a program before or during its conduct.
- 42. **Travel**. Senators and Members are required to fund their own travel to and from the program. If service transport is available for troop movement then this should be utilised wherever possible. Internal travel required during the option is to be borne by the conducting Service/Group.
- 43. **Meals and Accommodation**. All meals and accommodation required during attachment are to be provided at Commonwealth expense. ADFPP participants are to be considered 'On Duty' for the provision of meals and accommodation. If the program requires participants to be accommodated in non-Defence accommodation, the costs are to be borne by the relevant HO.
- 44. **Allowances**. No allowances are to be paid by Defence to ADFPP participants. Allowances payable to ADF personnel participating in the ADFPP Exchange Program are to be funded by the member's unit/HQ.

IMPLEMENTATION

- 45. This Directive is effective immediately and will remain extant until amended or withdrawn by me.
- 46. This Directive is sponsored by Director General Military Strategic Effects. The Executive Officer of the ADF Parliamentary Program is the point of contact for inquiries regarding this Directive, and will consult with Group Headquarters on any amendments. This Directive is to be reviewed no later than two years after promulgation or if arrangements significantly change.
