Annual Environmental Compliance Report for Defence training facilities, Greenbank Training Area, QLD (EPBC 2011/5896)

The document identifies the current status of the implementation of approval conditions issued under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (the EPBC Act) on 17 January 2012 for the project identified above.

Conditions attached to the approval	Current status
1. To protect habitat for listed threatened species, the person taking the action must not clear more than 69 hectares of vegetation on the site.	Compliant. Activities commenced on 6 February 2012 and were completed in April 2014.
2. The person taking the action must prepare and submit for approval an Environment Offset Strategy to the Minister. The Environment Offset Strategy must be submitted and approved by the Minister within 6 months of the date of this approval. The Environment Offset Strategy must provide for: the enhancement and protection of native vegetation; the riparian zone of water courses; and habitat for threatened species within the Greenbank Training Area. The Environment Offset Strategy must include the following: a. A commitment to rehabilitate and protect no less than 350 ha of remnant vegetation or regrowth within the Greenbank Training Area. The area identified can comprise either one single, or a number of individual areas, provided those areas are greater than 50 ha in size. offset areas to be rehabilitated and protected must include (but not be limited to) the following:

- (i) The location and boundaries of the area(s) through maps and textual descriptions as well as an accompanying shapefile(s);
 - (ii) A description of the regional ecosystem classification contained within the area(s) identified for remediation and protection. Information must also include records of high conservation value fauna and fauna species known from/likely to utilise these areas;
 - (iii) Detailed measures for controlling and managing invasive weeds in those areas identified for protection;
 - (iv) Information on how the remediation and protection of the area(s) will improve habitat connectivity for threatened species with the Greenbank/Karawatha Wildlife Corridor; and
 - (v) Key performance indicators and indicative timeframes for undertaking the rehabilitation and protection. The key performance indicators must be sufficient to confirm whether any remediation actions have resulted in a net environmental gain to the environmental values of the Greenbank Training area.
- b. Details of ongoing vertebrate surveys at Greenbank Training Area (excluding the range impact area). The monitoring must be of a design that will detect any great changes to the numbers of threatened species within the Greenbank Training Area;
 - c. Details of and a commitment to undertake landscape planting within the facilities. Plantings used must be naturally occurring within the Greenbank Training Area;
 - d. Details of and a commitment to undertake the decommissioning, remediation and revegetation within the footprint of the existing sewage treatment plant;
 - e. A commitment to undertake remediation actions that will halt soil erosion and increase bank stability from selected areas within Greenbank Training Area currently affected by soil erosion; and
 - f. A description of how the environmental management systems of the Department of Defence will provide for the permanent protection of areas described in 2(a) from inappropriate activities or actions that are not consistent with the maintenance of the conservation values of the Greenbank Training Area.

The Environment Offset Strategy must clearly state the legal person or persons responsible for implementation. If the Minister approves the Environment Offset Strategy then the approved Environment Offset Strategy must be implemented.

Note: It is not the intention that all training activities are excluded from the 350 ha area which is required to be protected under this condition. Activities that allow vegetation condition and habitat for the Spot-tailed Quoll and Koala to be maintained or enhanced will still be permissible.	
3. The person taking the action must prepare an annual Environment Performance Report and submit this to the department for approval within three (3) months of each anniversary of the date of commencement of construction. The Environment Performance Report must include detailed information on the following: a. Provide a progress report on all activities and results from all works required in condition 2. The results must be sufficient to demonstrate progress with achieving any key performance indicators and timeframes identified in the Environment Offset Strategy; b. Provide the results of ongoing monitoring by providing the records of individual animals and an annual population estimate of Spot-tailed Quolls and Koalas within the Greenbank Training Area; and c. Provide the results of monitoring as required in condition 2(b). The results of the monitoring must include a comparison of inter-annual variation and document any significant changes to the numbers of the Spot-tailed Quolls and Koalas within the Greenbank Training Area. The Environmental Performance Report must be published, maintained and be made publicly available on the person taking the action's websites for the life of the action. The first Environment Performance report must be submitted to the department 15 months from the date of approval of the Environmental Offset Strategy, with each subsequent report submitted 12 months from the date of the previous Environmental Performance Report. 4. To reduce the likely impacts of the construction activities on the environment, the person taking the action must prepare a Construction Environment Management Plan for the Minister's approval. The Construction Environment Management Plan must include the following measures: a. Measures to reduce the environmental damage from the movement of construction vehicles within and outside the Greenbank Training Area; b. Detailed hygiene protocols suitable for controlling the introduction and spread of invasive weeds due to construction activities; c. Sediment and erosion control measures to manage the movement of sediment on site; and d. Clearly state the legal person or persons responsible for implementing the Construction	Non-compliant, however a draft CEMP has been prepared, and finalisation will be subject to discussions with DoE. The CEMP will be finalised in parallel with the offset strategy.

Environment Management Plan. The approved Construction Environment Management Plan must be implemented until all stages of construction have been completed.	
5. To mitigate potential impacts associated with ongoing operation activities within Greenbank Training Area, the person taking the action must manage the environmental impact of its activities within the Greenbank Training Area consistent with the Environmental Management System certified under ISO 14000:2004.	Compliant (ongoing)
6. Prior to the removal of any buildings identified as having heritage value in the preliminary documentation, the person taking the action must undertake a full archival photographic record of any heritage fabric identified as having heritage significance in section 2.33 of the preliminary documentation. The full archival photographic record must be consistent with the Queensland Government's 'Guideline: Archival Recording of Heritage Places'. The full archival photographic record must be submitted to the department within three months of the commencement of construction.	Compliant (4 July 2012)
7. Within 30 days of the commencement of the action, the person taking the action must advise the department in writing of the actual date of commencement.	Compliant (Defence letter 2011/1030487/1 of 22 February 2011 refers).
8. The person taking the action must maintain accurate records substantiating all activities associated with or relevant to the conditions of approval, including measures taken to implement the Environment Offset Strategy required by this approval, and make them available upon request to the department. Such records may be subject to audit by the department or an independent auditor in accordance with section 458 of the EPBC Act, or used to verify compliance with the conditions of approval. Summaries of audits will be posted on the Department's website. The results of audits may also be publicised through the general media.	Not applicable yet
9. By 15 July of each year after the commencement of the action, the person taking the action must publish a report on their websites addressing compliance with the conditions of this approval over the previous 12 months. Non-compliance with any of the conditions of this approval must be reported to the department at the same time as the compliance report is published.	2014 Compliant (this report)

10. Within three months of every 12 month anniversary of the commencement of the action, the person taking the action must publish a report on their website addressing compliance with each of the conditions of this approval. Documentary evidence providing proof of the date of publication and non-compliance with any of the conditions in this approval must be provided to the department at the same time as the compliance report is published.	Non-compliant, however subject to further discussion with DoE. Refer to condition 9.
11. Upon the direction of the Minister, the person taking the action must ensure that an independent audit of compliance with the conditions of approval is conducted and a report is submitted to the Minister. The independent auditor must be approved by the Minister prior to the commencement of the audit. Audit criteria must be agreed to by the Minister and the audit report must address the criteria to the satisfaction of the Minister.	Not yet applicable
12. If the person taking the action wishes to carry out any activity otherwise than in accordance with the Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan as specified in the conditions, the person taking the action must submit to the department for the Minister's written approval a revised version of that Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan. The varied activity shall not commence until the Minister has approved the varied Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan, in writing. The Minister will not approve the varied Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan unless the revised Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan would result in an equivalent or improved environmental outcome over time. If the Minister approves the revised Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan, that Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan must be implemented in place of the Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan originally approved. 13. If the Minister believes that it is necessary or convenient for the better protection of listed threatened species and communities and the environment from impacts by a Commonwealth agency to do so, the Minister may request that the person taking the action to make specified revisions to the Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan specified in the conditions of approval and submit the revised Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan for the Minister's written approval. The person taking the action must comply with	Not yet applicable

any such request. The revised approved Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan must be implemented. Unless the Minister has approved the revised Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan, then the person taking the action must continue to implement the Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan originally approved, as specified in the conditions.	
14. If, at any time after five years from the date of this approval, the person taking the action has not substantially commenced the action, then the person taking the action must not substantially commence the action without the written agreement of the Minister	Not applicable
15. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Minister, the person taking the action must publish the Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan referred to in these conditions of approval on their website. The Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan must be published on the website within one month of being approved and must remain published until all actions in the strategy are completed to the satisfaction of the Minister. 16. Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by the Minister, the person taking the action must provide a copy of the approved Environment Offset Strategy or Construction Environment Management Plan referred to in these conditions of approval to members of the public upon request. Copies must be provided within a reasonable time of the request.	Not yet applicable
