- a. For wear on jacket, cold weather.
- b. The 100% Cotton Disruptive Pattern Combat Uniform (DPCU) coat and trousers have been withdrawn from the Inventory. A Disposal Directive for the 100% Cotton DPCU Coat and Trousers was issued in June 2014, and no further issues of this item are to be carried out. Members are to wear near infrared (NIR) DPCU Coat and Trousers in lieu.
- c. Initial issue at 17SQN Tindal, members to retain all items on posting. Items are to be returned when the member discharges.
- d. Total quantity issued is not to exceed 5 as part of a member's initial free issue (IFI). This is accumulative across all scales. After IFI, personnel are required to purchase additional name tags.
- e. Initial Free Issue of Bag, Carry All, is authorised for members entitled under Legend A. Carry All Bag is not to be exchanged.



Instructor Notes

Helmet Colours

Helmets are coloured primarily to ensure that they are highly conspicuous at an incident. The types of colours and reflective tapes used on helmets are designed to maximise their visibility in a variety of conditions during the day or night.

Many agencies also use colour-coded helmets to indicate rank or the function of personnel at an incident.

The ADF Fire Services utilize the following colour coding scheme:

RAAF

- White Firefighter, NCO Fire fighter/Structural Fire Controller
- · Red SNCO Firefighter, Airfield Fire Controller, Fire Manager

ARA

- White Emergency Responder (ER), Operator Emergency Response (OER SPR/LCPL).
- Yellow -- Commander Emergency Response Operations (CERO CPL).
- Red Supervisor Emergency Response Operations (SERO SGT), Manager Emergency Response Operations (MERO WO2/WO1).
