For the record, I spoke to ^{\$47E(d)} who gave me his feedback, supporting what we originally

provided.

As discussed, the summary of our opinion is:

We have reviewed the proposed changes and do not have any objection to the proposal. This is based on our view that the proposed changes do not distract or change from the intent of the CA regulation. We have also done a scrub of what other terms may require changing (to ensure that the regs are gender neutral). There are no DCPs in work that require updates to include the new gender neutral language.

That said, we have a couple of opportunities for improvement, for the gender neutral project:

- Use "work-hours" or "person- hours" in lieu of proposed "staff-hours"- as staff-hours is very likely to cause unnecessary confusion and may not align with Defence vocabulary.
- Gender neutral **project may also want to consider the "Man- Machine" in its scope (if it has not already)**. We have had female operators for a significant period of time. This issue does not affect the CA regs – only 21. Suggest DASA use "human machine interface" in lieu of "man-machine interface" (noting that the "human machine" is actually in use in 21 already).
