- Australia is proud to work side-by-side with Fiji through our Vuvale partnership, including through our long-standing Defence Cooperation Program and the strong partnership between the ADF and the Republic of Fiji Military Forces
- Through this program, we are increasing our personnel exchanges, especially through senior embeds, which is key to growing the close bonds between our defence forces.
  - We stand ready to work closely with our Fijian partners on how we can deepen the connections between our militaries.
- Currently, there are no direct pathways for foreign nationals to join the Australian Defence Force
  (ADF), as Australian Citizenship is generally considered a requirement for service in the ADF, with
  limited exceptions for permanent residents.
