




How to Export DSGL goods, or goods containing DSGL technology (tangible)

Step 1

- To commence an application to obtain an export permit for a military or dual-use item, select the 'Start application' button on the MADE landing page.



- Select 'Apply' for the 'Export or Supply Controlled Goods and Technology' single or combined option. If you select the combined option, your application must contain both Physically Exported and Intangibly supplied line items. You will be required to acknowledge and sign two separate 'statement by applicant' consents.





- Select your 'Client registration number' that will have been provided at the completion of the DCRN Application process. You may enter an 'Internal reference number', specific to your organisation, to assist with identifying and locating the application at a later date.
- Once you have done this, select 'Continue'.

- Select the 'Application type' drop-down box and choose the application type that is relevant to your needs. For the purposes of this guide, we will be selecting 'Apply for a new permit'. But if you are looking to obtain an 'in-principle assessment' or are exporting an item for which you have previously obtained an 'in-principle assessment', select those options as appropriate.

- Respond to the question about whether you believe or suspect the exported or supplied items may be used in a WMD program by selecting either 'yes' or 'no', then select 'Continue'.


