19. GRANT OF THE KOREA MEDAL FOR SERVICE IN THE KOREA OPERATIONS.

1. Royal Approval has been given to the award of the Korea Medal for service in the operations in Korea. The Medal has been issued in general recognition of service by British Commonwealth Forces on behalf of the United Nations in repelling aggression in Korea.

2. Description.— The Medal bears on the obverse the Uncrowned Effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth the Second, and on the reverse a representation of Hercules playing the Hydra, with the word KOREA in the exergue.

The ribbon is of three yellow and two light blue vertical stripes arranged alternately.

3. Persons Eligible.—

(a) Members of the Australian Military Forces.

(b) Accredited representatives of approved philanthropic organisations attached to the forces on full time duty in uniform.

(c) Press Correspondents, officially accredited by the Australian Army for service with British Commonwealth Forces, who wore the approved uniform and were subject to military discipline.

4. Qualifying Conditions.—

(a) Members of the Australian Military Forces and accredited representatives of philanthropic organisations.—

(i) Service of one day or more on the posted strength of a unit or formation in Korea between 1 Jul 50 and 27 Jul 53, both dates inclusive. Visitors, although posted to the Australian Auxiliary Unit must complete the service shown in sub-para (ii) below;

(ii) Official visits, inspections, etc., on duty in Korea between 1 Jul 50 and 27 Jul 53 both dates inclusive, provided that they amount to thirty days either continuous or aggregated. *Excluding ETC*

MDL 39/1954 is amended as follows :—

(a) At the end of para 4(a)(ii) add new sentence—

"If qualifying service was being rendered on 27th July, 1953, the reduced period of service will be a qualification for the award."

operations will not be eligible for the award of the Korea
Medal.

5. Provisional Approval to wear the ribbon:-

(a) Provided a member has rendered the required qualify-
ing service, COs of units may issue provisional approval for
the member to wear the ribbon of the Korea Medal, based on a
check of the applicant's personal records held by the unit.

(b) A member's CO will cause an entry to be made as
follows in the member's Record of Service Book (AAB 83)
signed by an officer :-

"Approved to wear the ribbon of the Korea Medal subject to
verification by CARO".

6. The provisional authority issued by the CO for the wear-
ing of the ribbon does not constitute an authority for the
issue of the Medal itself.

7. Issue of Ribbon:- A free issue of the ribbon of the
Medal will be made to all ranks authorised to wear the ribbon,
on the following basis :-

- (a) 6½ inches to Colonels and above;
(b) 5 inches to all ranks below Colonel.

The issue of the ribbon will be recorded in the member's
AAB 83 under "Records of Personal Issues".

8. Award of Medal:-

(a) In conformity with the principles adopted in relation
to Campaign Stars and commemorative medals awarded for service
in the 1939-45 war, approval has been given for the Korea
Medal to be inscribed with the army number, initials and sur-
name of the recipients.

(b) The issue of the Korea Medal will be made only upon
application by the person entitled to receive it. Application
showing army number, rank, name, initials, and address of
the applicant, should be forwarded to CARO.

(c) Decisions regarding Korea Medals earned by deceased
members of the Australian Military Forces will be distributed
in accordance with the War Services Estates Act, 1942.

Applications from persons who consider that they are
entitled to receive such award should be referred to CARO.

when the applicants will be advised to whom the medal is to be issued. Applications should contain the following :-

- (i) Full name and address of applicant;
- (ii) Army number, rank, and full name of deceased;
- (iii) Relationship of applicant to deceased.

9. Personnel of the ADF who have rendered qualifying service in the Royal Australian Navy, Royal Australian Air Force or other British Commonwealth Forces :-

- (a) Applications for the Korea Medal which require verification of previous service will be referred to CARO and not direct to the Service department or the country concerned.
- (b) CARO will arrange for the issue of the Korea Medal to all serving personnel of the ADF, irrespective of the service (i.e., RAN, RAAF or other British Commonwealth Forces) in which the qualifying service was rendered.

10. Members of philanthropic organisations.- Applications for the medal by representatives of approved philanthropic organisations will be made to the Secretary at the headquarters of the organisation to which the individual belonged during the period of service in respect of which the claim is made. The Secretary should make such recommendation as is appropriate and forward the claim to CARO for verification and issue of the award.

11. Press Correspondents.- Applications for the Medal by Press Correspondents will be made to Central Army Records Office.

12. Mention in Despatches.- Where a member has been mentioned in despatches for service in the Korea operations the single bronze oak leaf Emblem will be worn on the ribbon of the Korea Medal.
