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The Career Network

Defence Industry Internship Program

The Career Network is **seeking expressions of interest** from SMEs for the Commonwealth-funded Defence Industry Internship Program (DIIP).

An initiative of the Department of Defence, DIIP provides third- and fourth-year engineering and technology university students with **direct connections to the defence industry** by facilitating a **12-week paid internship** in small to medium defence industry businesses across Australia. SMEs receive intern wage reimbursements plus an additional \$547 per week per intern.

Host applications are open now, closing on Friday 25 July 2025. Intern applications open 28 July 2025 and close 31 August 2025.

Business grants

Industry Growth Program

This program helps Australian SMEs scale by providing expert **advisory services** and **access to grants**. Businesses can receive tailored advice on commercialisation, growth strategies and funding options. Eligible businesses may apply for **grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$5 million**, and must be:

- Producing innovative products or services aimed at commercial growth.
- Significantly raising manufacturing capability in an area outlined by the National Reconstruction Fund.

Tasmania

Defence Industry Tender Support Program TAS

This program supports **Tasmanian-based advanced manufacturers** and **technology enterprises** to seek specialist bid and tender writing **consultants to support the preparation of defence tenders**.

There are two tiers of assistance available:

- Procurement value of \$3 million to \$10 million (maximum grant \$15,000)
- Procurement value of over \$10 million (maximum grant \$30,000)

Note: Please check your eligibility for financial assistance from the program.

Defence Industry Development Grants Program

Applications for Security and Exports Streams closing soon

The Defence Industry Development Grants (DIDG) Program funds Australian SMEs to build Australia's sovereign capability, global competitiveness, technical superiority and national security. Applications are assessed based upon (1) the extent to which the grant project will help the business contribute to one or more of the detailed Sovereign Defence Industrial Priorities; (2) the business' capacity, capability and resources to deliver the grant project and potential commercial benefits. Applications must be focused on the eligible activities which are listed in section 5.1 and A.2 of the **Grant** Opportunity Guidelines.

Tips before applying:

- Refer to the **DIDG guidance for applicants**.
- Check if you're ready to apply for a grant.
- Read the <u>Grant Opportunity</u> <u>Guidelines</u>.
- Refer to the grants page for example applications and templates.

Applications for the Security stream and Exports stream will close on Monday 30 June 2025 and Thursday 31 July, respectively.

Policy Guidance

Complying with the **Environmentally** Sustainable **Procurement Policy**

From 1 July 2025, the Environmentally Sustainable Procurement Policy will expand from construction services procurements to include furniture, fittings and equipment (FFE), as well as ICT goods and textiles.

Suppliers are invited to join a webinar on 18 June 2025 for guidance on how to comply with the policy.

This will include how to complete a Supplier Environmental Sustainability Plan when tendering and what you need to report on when supplying.
