Sentencing: Facts and legal principles

The defendant pleaded guilty to one charge of assaulting a subordinate. He assaulted a junior female sailor in licenced premises in Darwin on 8 Nov 2024. She was in his chain of command and he was socialising with her and her group of friends. He touched her momentarily with minimum force on her buttocks which was captured on video. She made immediate complaint to her partner and another friend. The defendant pleaded guilty at the first available opportunity mitigating on the basis he touched his subordinate intending it to be a friendly gesture but accepted his actions were unlawful. In prosecuting for this offence, the prosecution disavowed any sexual element, intent or circumstance.

The defendant had a 21-year exemplary service as an enlisted member and commissioned officer (commissioned in 2022). He had a wife and two young children. He demonstrated significant remorse and pleaded guilty at the first available opportunity. He had good prospects of rehabilitation.

Punishments and orders

Charge 1	Forfeiture of seniority, new seniority to date from 24 Oct 23; Fined the sum of \$1,000 (\$1,000 suspended).
