## 2025 DISP Industry Forum

The Defence Industry Security Program (DISP) has successfully hosted its second industry forum, drawing more than 700 security professionals from across Government and industry in Sydney on 24–25 July.

The 2025 DISP Industry Forum brought together representatives from hundreds of Defence supply chain companies for two days of insightful security briefings, interactive workshops, networking opportunities, and presentations delivered by leaders from Government and industry.

Centred on the theme, 'Defence Secured: Industry Excellence', the forum explored the specific security threats facing the defence sector, particularly SMEs, including foreign interference, insider threats, and protests.

Membership in DISP is open to any Australian entity seeking to engage with the Defence supply chain. Members enjoy access to events, as well as broader benefits that support their security resilience and industry readiness.

Module 2 of the Defence and Industry Study Course (DISC) delivered another intensive week of company site visits and briefings, featuring the Hunter Class Frigate Program, NSSG and ASC, and representatives from the Western Australian and South Australian Governments.

Participants gained valuable insights into the critical role played by both states in the <u>National Defence Strategy</u>, including observing the rapid progress of works at **HMAS Stirling**, and exposure to cutting-edge developments in **radar systems and future space technologies** in Adelaide.

Key site visits featured a tour of **HMAS Arafura**, an offshore patrol vessel commissioned in June 2025, and **HMAS Hobart**, currently undergoing upgrades. Participants also explored the **Submarine Escape Training Centre** at HMAS Stirling and toured **Osborne Naval Shipyard Precinct**, where they experienced the scale of infrastructure supporting current and future shipbuilding.

Looking ahead, Module 3 will take place in Queensland in October with a focus on **Air Force**. Participants will have the chance to engage with Queensland's rapidly expanding defence sector and learn how it is supporting the National Defence Strategy and broader Government priorities.

The Australian Signals Directorate (ASD) has collaborated with the Department of Industry Science and Resources (DISR) and international partners to release 'Managing cryptographic keys and secrets'.

The publication is written for organisational security personnel, including architects, IT security, crypto custodians and managers, and applies to Cloud Service Providers and enterprise organisations with on-premises or hybrid environments.

Knowing the current and emerging threat environment enables you to implement relevant security mitigations to prevent, minimise and detect compromise. This will reduce the overall impact to your organisation.
