



**Address:** Corner of Stewart Street and Kissing Point Road, Dundas, NSW 2117

**Size:** 3.10 hectares

Located in Dundas, near Parramatta, approximately 17km to the northwest of Sydney CBD. The barracks was established in 1968.

### Site Functions

This site serves as a logistics support base for the Army Reserves and as a training facility for Cadets. Government will engage with existing tenants as part of the divestment process.

### Relocation Options
