



## Latchford Barracks, VIC

**Size:** 220 hectares

Latchford Barracks is one of the four garrisons within the Albury-Wodonga Military Area. The Barracks is located approximately 10km away from the other garrisons and was originally built as a personnel staging camp during World War II.

### Site Functions

This site serves as office space, logistics, live-in accommodation, and provides field training areas, a simulation training centre and Army Reserves training facility.
