POSTURE s22(1)(b)(ii)

- **ARRIVAL:** REACTIVE. All media enquiries to be dealt with via extant MECC process.
- CO Kuttabul (CAPT M Shand) will be the senior officer to welcome the NETF.
- POST-ARRIVAL: REACTIVE. PLA-N may invite media to their ships at various times during the duration of their port visit.
 - All media visits are to be approved by CO Kuttabul, in consultation with MECC Division, and an ADF officer is to escort media from the main gate to the ship's gangway (and return).
 - Media will only be permitted to record on board the PLA-N ships, and may not access any other part of the base unless approved by CO Kuttabul.

CONTEXT S22(1)(b)(ii)

The PLA-Navy's 31st Naval Expeditionary Task Force (NETF), consisting of three ships (*Xuchang* FFG-536, *Luoma Hu* AOR-964 and *Kunlun Shan* LPD-998) will visit Sydney over the period of 03–07 June 2019 for a routine port visit as the task force returns from a deployment.

The task force deployed to the Gulf of Aden to conduct counter piracy operations in December 2018, \$33(a)(iii), \$33(b)

Key Messages

- Pleased to welcome a PLA-N task force to Sydney for a port visit.
 - Australia welcomes China's contributions to global security, including its participation in UN peacekeeping, humanitarian and disaster relief, and anti-piracy operations.
 - The PLA-N task force is comprised of the Jiangkai II frigate Xuchang (FFG-536), the Fuchi auxiliary replenishment ship Luoma Hu (AOR-964) and the landing platform dock Kunlun Shan (LPD-998).
 - This visit is part of an extended deployment for the PLA-N task force which recently conducted anti-piracy operations in the Gulf of Aden.
- Port visits are a routine activity conducted by all navies to undertake low level maintenance and provide valuable opportunities for crew respite.
 - The last PLA-N visit to FBE occurred in Jun 2017.
 - HMAS Melbourne is the most recent RAN warship to visit China, visiting Qingdao in late April (2019) for the PLA-N's International Fleet Review.

Talking Points

General

- A People's Liberation Army—Navy's Task Force is conducting a routine port visit to Sydney over the period of 3—7 June 2019.
- This visit is part of an extended deployment for the PLA-N task force which recently conducted anti-piracy operations in the Gulf of Aden.
- The PLA-N Task Force is comprised of the Jiangkai II frigate Xuchang (FFG-536), the Fuchi auxiliary replenishment ship Luoma Hu (AOR-964) and the landing platform dock Kunlun Shan (LPD-998).
- Over 730 PLA-N officers and sailors are embarked in the three PLA-N ships for the visit to Sydney.
- The RAN wishes forward to engagement with the PLA-N officers a relaxing and enjoyable visit to Sydney.
